CHAPTER _____

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Transportation – Highways – Heroes Highway**

3 FOR the purpose of requiring the State Highway Administration to dedicate a certain
4 portion of Maryland Route 924 as Heroes Highway; making this Act an emergency
5 measure; and generally relating to Heroes Highway.

6 BY adding to

7 Article – Transportation

8 Section 8–657

9 Annotated Code of Maryland

11 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
12 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

13 **Article – Transportation**

14 **8–657.**

1 **THE ADMINISTRATION SHALL DEDICATE THE PORTION OF MARYLAND ROUTE**
 2 **924 (EMMORTON ROAD) BETWEEN THE INTERSECTION OF MARYLAND ROUTE 24**
 3 **AND MARYLAND ROUTE 924 AND THE INTERSECTION OF SINGER ROAD AND**
 4 **MARYLAND ROUTE 924 AS HEROES HIGHWAY.**

5 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency
 6 measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety, has
 7 been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the members elected to
 8 each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is
 9 enacted.
