Commemorative Weeks - Chesapeake Bay Awareness Week

This bill requires the Governor to annually proclaim the second week in June as Chesapeake Bay Awareness Week. The proclamation must urge educational and environmental organizations to observe Chesapeake Bay Awareness Week properly with appropriate events, activities, and programs designed to increase awareness of the importance of the Chesapeake Bay to the State, the region, and the United States.

The bill takes effect June 1, 2016.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: None. Urging educational and environmental organizations to observe Chesapeake Bay Awareness Week does not affect State finances.

Local Effect: None.

Small Business Effect: None.

Analysis

Current Law: Twelve official commemorative days and six months are recognized in State law, as shown in **Exhibit 1**. The Governor also must issue a proclamation each year encouraging citizens and other individuals to observe a moment of silence at 3 p.m. on Memorial Day to unite in remembrance and commemorate the heroic acts and efforts of Marylanders who have served and died in the U.S. Armed Forces.

Background: The Chesapeake Bay is the largest estuary in the United States, spanning six states and the District of Columbia. Fed by 50 major tributaries, the bay contains more than 15 trillion gallons of water and produces more than 500 million pounds of seafood harvest annually, including crabs, oysters, and rockfish. The Chesapeake Bay area is home to more than 17 million people, 3,600 species of plants and animals, and two of the five major shipping ports in the North Atlantic: Baltimore and Hampton Roads. The bay

provides important economic resources, as well as recreational and educational experiences both in and around the water.
