A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **State Lottery Agency – Tickets – Electronic Devices Connected to the**
3 **Internet**

4 FOR the purpose of prohibiting the Director of the State Lottery Agency, unless
5 authorized by the General Assembly, from adopting regulations that would
6 allow a person to purchase a State lottery ticket through an electronic device
7 that connects to the Internet; making this Act an emergency measure; and
8 generally relating to the State Lottery Agency.

14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
15 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

16 **Article – State Government**

17 9–110.

18 (a) **[With] SUBJECT TO SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION AND WITH** the
19 approval of the Commission, the Director may adopt regulations of the Agency.

20 (b) The regulations of the Agency shall provide for:

21 (1) all matters that are necessary or desirable for the efficient and
22 economical operation and administration of the State lottery; and

1 (2) the convenience of buyers of State lottery tickets and shares and of
2 the holders of a winning ticket or share.

3 **(C) UNLESS AUTHORIZED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY, THE DIRECTOR**
4 **MAY NOT ADOPT REGULATIONS CREATING THE OPTION TO PURCHASE A STATE**
5 **LOTTERY TICKET THROUGH AN ELECTRONIC DEVICE THAT CONNECTS TO THE**
6 **INTERNET, SUCH AS A PERSONAL COMPUTER OR MOBILE DEVICE.**

7 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency
8 measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety,
9 has been passed by a ye and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the members
10 elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from
11 the date it is enacted.
