A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Correctional Facilities – Inmate Programs in Washington County – Payment**
3 **of Child Support**

4 FOR the purpose of requiring an inmate participating in certain home detention, work
5 release, or pretrial release programs in Washington County to be responsible for
6 costs of child support; and generally relating to child support and inmate
7 programs in Washington County.

13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
14 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

15 **Article – Correctional Services**

16 11–723.

17 (a) This section applies only in Washington County.

18 (b) (1) The Sheriff shall:

19 (i) establish and administer:

20 1. a home detention program;

21 2. a work release program; and

1 3. a pretrial release program; and

2 (ii) adopt regulations necessary to implement each program
3 established under this section.

4 (2) At the time of sentencing or at any time during an individual's
5 confinement, the court may allow an individual who is placed in the custody of the
6 Sheriff to participate in any program established under this section.

7 (3) Subject to paragraph (4) of this subsection, an inmate is eligible to
8 participate in any program established under this section if the inmate:

9 (i) is recommended for the program by the court; and

10 (ii) meets eligibility criteria set by the Sheriff.

11 (4) An inmate is not eligible to participate in any program established
12 under this section if the inmate:

13 (i) is incarcerated for or has been convicted previously of a
14 crime of violence listed in § 14–101 of the Criminal Law Article; or

15 (ii) has been found guilty of the crime of:

16 1. child abuse under § 3–601 or § 3–602 of the Criminal
17 Law Article; or

18 2. escape under § 9–404 of the Criminal Law Article.

19 (5) While participating in any program established under this section
20 an inmate is responsible for:

21 (i) the inmate's medical care and related expenses; and

22 (ii) costs of lodging, food, clothing, transportation, restitution,
23 **CHILD SUPPORT**, and taxes.

24 (6) The Sheriff may:

25 (i) collect a reasonable fee from each inmate participating in
26 any program established under this section; or

27 (ii) waive or reduce the fee.

28 (7) The Sheriff may determine the maximum number of inmates that
29 may participate in any program established under this section.

1 (8) An inmate who knowingly violates a term or a condition of any
2 program established under this section is subject to the penalties provided under §
3 11-726 of this subtitle and to other disciplinary action provided by law.

4 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
5 October 1, 2013.
