A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Income Tax – Earned Income Credit – Refundable Amount**

3 FOR the purpose of altering, for certain taxable years, the percentage of the federal
4 earned income credit used for determining the amount that an individual may
5 claim as a refund under the Maryland earned income credit under certain
6 circumstances; and generally relating to the earned income credit allowed under
7 the State income tax.

18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
19 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

20 **Article – Tax – General**

21 10–704.

22 (a) (1) An individual may claim a credit against the State income tax for a
23 taxable year in the amount determined under subsection (b) of this section for earned
24 income.

EXPLANATION: CAPITALS INDICATE MATTER ADDED TO EXISTING LAW.

1 (2) An individual may claim a credit against the county income tax for
2 a taxable year in the amount determined under subsection (c) of this section for earned
3 income.

4 (b) (1) Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection and subject
5 to subsection (d) of this section, the credit allowed against the State income tax under
6 subsection (a)(1) of this section is the lesser of:

7 (i) 50% of the earned income credit allowable for the taxable
8 year under § 32 of the Internal Revenue Code; or

9 (ii) the State income tax for the taxable year.

10 (2) (I) An individual may claim a refund in the amount, if any, by
11 which [25%] **THE APPLICABLE PERCENTAGE SPECIFIED IN SUBPARAGRAPH (II)**
12 **OF THIS PARAGRAPH** of the earned income credit allowable for the taxable year
13 under § 32 of the Internal Revenue Code exceeds the State income tax for the taxable
14 year.

15 **(II) THE APPLICABLE PERCENTAGE OF THE EARNED**
16 **INCOME CREDIT ALLOWABLE UNDER § 32 OF THE INTERNAL REVENUE CODE TO**
17 **BE USED FOR PURPOSES OF DETERMINING THE REFUND PROVIDED UNDER THIS**
18 **PARAGRAPH IS:**

19 **1. 26% FOR A TAXABLE YEAR BEGINNING AFTER**
20 **DECEMBER 31, 2013, BUT BEFORE JANUARY 1, 2015;**

21 **2. 27% FOR A TAXABLE YEAR BEGINNING AFTER**
22 **DECEMBER 31, 2014, BUT BEFORE JANUARY 1, 2016;**

23 **3. 28% FOR A TAXABLE YEAR BEGINNING AFTER**
24 **DECEMBER 31, 2015, BUT BEFORE JANUARY 1, 2017;**

25 **4. 29% FOR A TAXABLE YEAR BEGINNING AFTER**
26 **DECEMBER 31, 2016, BUT BEFORE JANUARY 1, 2018; AND**

27 **5. 30% FOR A TAXABLE YEAR BEGINNING AFTER**
28 **DECEMBER 31, 2017.**

29 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
30 July 1, 2014.
