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## CHAPTER \_\_\_\_\_

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Maryland Commission on Climate Change**

3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Commission on Climate Change in the Department of  
4 the Environment to advise the Governor and General Assembly on ways to mitigate  
5 the causes of, prepare for, and adapt to the consequences of climate change;  
6 establishing the membership of the Commission; ~~requiring certain members to serve~~  
7 ~~as chair and vice chair of the Commission;~~ providing for the terms of a member of  
8 the Commission; authorizing the Governor to remove a member of the Commission  
9 under certain circumstances; prohibiting a member of the Commission from  
10 receiving certain compensation, but authorizing a member to be reimbursed for  
11 certain expenses; requiring the Commission to establish certain working groups;  
12 requiring the Chair of the Commission to appoint working group members who  
13 represent certain public and private interests; requiring the Commission to prioritize  
14 certain working group actions; requiring the Commission, on or before a certain date  
15 each year, to report to the Governor and General Assembly; requiring each State  
16 agency to complete a certain review in accordance with certain requirements;  
17 requiring each State agency to identify and recommend certain changes to certain  
18 programs under certain circumstances; requiring certain State agencies to report  
19 annually to the Governor and General Assembly on the status of certain programs;  
20 requiring the University of Maryland Center for Environmental Science to establish  
21 and update certain sea level rise projections; requiring the sea level rise projections  
22 to include certain maps and to be made publicly available on the Internet; providing  
23 for the construction of this Act; establishing the intent of the General Assembly;  
24 requiring the Commission members and working group members to be appointed

12 Preamble

13 WHEREAS, As reported by the United Nations Intergovernmental Panel on Climate  
14 Change (IPCC) in March 2014, the effects of climate change are already occurring on all  
15 continents and across the oceans, and numerous opportunities exist to respond to and  
16 mitigate associated risks; and

17 WHEREAS, Maryland has already experienced some effects of climate change,  
18 including sea level rise of more than 1 foot in the last century, increasing water  
19 temperatures in the Chesapeake Bay, more rain and flooding in the winter and spring, and  
20 less in the summer; and

21 WHEREAS, Maryland has demonstrated its strong commitment to addressing the  
22 drivers and consequences of climate change by passing several laws, including the Healthy  
23 Air Act, the Maryland Clean Cars Act of 2007, the Greenhouse Gas Emissions Reduction  
24 Act of 2009, the Maryland Offshore Wind Energy Act of 2013, and the Coast Smart Council;  
25 and

26 WHEREAS, Although the Maryland Commission on Climate Change was created by  
27 Executive Order 01.01.2007.07 in 2007, and then strengthened by Executive Order  
28 01.01.2014.14 in 2014, there is not a statutory body in the State whose sole purpose is to  
29 address climate change impacts and make recommendations to the Governor and General  
30 Assembly; now, therefore,

31 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,  
32 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

13 APPOINTED MEMBERS.

14           (3) AT THE END OF A TERM, A MEMBER CONTINUES TO SERVE UNTIL  
15 A SUCCESSOR IS APPOINTED AND QUALIFIES.

16           (4) A MEMBER WHO IS APPOINTED AFTER A TERM HAS BEGUN SERVES  
17 ONLY FOR THE REMAINDER OF THAT TERM AND UNTIL A SUCCESSOR IS APPOINTED  
18 AND QUALIFIES.

19           (5) THE GOVERNOR MAY REMOVE AN APPOINTED MEMBER FOR  
20 INCOMPETENCE, MISCONDUCT, OR FAILURE TO PERFORM THE DUTIES OF THE  
21 POSITION.

22           (D) A MEMBER OF THE COMMISSION MAY NOT RECEIVE COMPENSATION,  
23 BUT IS ENTITLED TO REIMBURSEMENT FOR EXPENSES UNDER THE STANDARD  
24 STATE TRAVEL REGULATIONS, AS PROVIDED IN THE STATE BUDGET.

17 (A) THE UNIVERSITY OF MARYLAND CENTER FOR ENVIRONMENTAL  
18 SCIENCE SHALL ESTABLISH SCIENCE-BASED SEA LEVEL RISE PROJECTIONS FOR  
19 MARYLAND'S COASTAL AREAS AND UPDATE THEM AT LEAST EVERY 5 YEARS.

20 (B) THE SCIENCE-BASED SEA LEVEL RISE PROJECTIONS SHALL INCLUDE  
21 MAPS THAT INDICATE THE AREAS OF THE STATE THAT MAY BE MOST AFFECTED BY  
22 STORM SURGES, FLOODING, AND EXTREME WEATHER EVENTS.

24 THIS SECTION SHALL BE MADE PUBLICLY AVAILABLE ON THE INTERNET.

25 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, before June 1, 2016, nothing  
26 in this Act shall be construed to affect the current membership and duties of the Maryland  
27 Commission on Climate Change, established by Executive Order 01.01.2014.14. It is the  
28 intent of the General Assembly that the Maryland Commission on Climate Change,  
29 established by Executive Order 01.01.2014.14, shall continue to meet and complete its tasks  
30 for 1 year following the enactment of this Act and until members are appointed to the

1 Maryland Commission on Climate Change, established by this Act, in accordance with  
 2 Section 3 of this Act.

3 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, on or before July 1, 2016, the  
 4 members and working group members of the Maryland Commission on Climate Change,  
 5 established in accordance with Section 1 of this Act, shall be appointed and a meeting shall  
 6 be convened. Nothing in this Act shall preclude the appointment of a member to the  
 7 Maryland Commission on Climate Change, established in accordance with this Act, who  
 8 served as a member of the Maryland Commission on Climate Change, established by  
 9 Executive Order 01.01.2014.14.

10 SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, on or before October 1, 2016,  
 11 each working group established by Section 1 of this Act shall meet and establish a work  
 12 plan.
