3 **Material – Venue**

4 FOR the purpose of adding an additional venue in which a person may be prosecuted for a
5 false statement concerning a destructive device or toxic material; making certain
6 stylistic changes; and generally relating to false statements concerning a destructive
7 device or toxic material.

18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
19 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

20 **Article – Criminal Law**

2 (b) A person may not circulate or transmit to another, with intent that it be acted
3 on, a statement or rumor that the person knows to be false about the location or possible
4 detonation of a destructive device or the location or possible release of toxic material, as
5 those terms are defined in § 4-501 of this article.

6 (d) A crime under this section committed using a telephone or other electronic
7 means may be prosecuted **IN THE COUNTY IN WHICH:**

8 (1) [in the county in which] the communication originated; [or]

9 (2) [in the county in which] the communication was received; **OR**

10 (3) **THE DESTRUCTIVE DEVICE OR TOXIC MATERIAL WAS STATED OR**
11 **WAS RUMORED TO BE LOCATED.**

12 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
13 October 1, 2016.
