2 **Frederick County – Alcohol Awareness Program – Absence From Licensed**
3 **Premises**

4 FOR the purpose of authorizing in Frederick County an individual certified by an approved
5 alcohol awareness program to be absent from a licensed premises for a personal or
6 business reason under certain circumstances; and generally relating to alcoholic
7 beverages in Frederick County.

14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
15 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

16 **Article – Alcoholic Beverages**

17 20–1903.

18 (a) (1) The individual certified by an approved alcohol awareness program
19 may be absent from the licensed premises for **A PERSONAL OR BUSINESS REASON OR** an
20 emergency if:

1 (i) the **PERSONAL OR BUSINESS REASON OR** emergency meets
2 standards that the Board sets by regulation; and

3 (ii) the absence lasts for not more than 2 hours.

4 (2) The Board shall require the license holder to keep a log book on the
5 licensed premises that documents each temporary absence, the length of time of the
6 absence, and the reason for the absence, in the form that the Board requires.

7 (b) A license holder who violates this section is subject to:

8 (1) for a first offense, a \$100 fine; and

9 (2) for each subsequent offense, a fine not exceeding \$500 or a suspension
10 or revocation of the license or both.

11 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July
12 1, 2016.
