A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Creation of a State Debt – Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2017,**
3 **and the Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loans of 2009, 2012, 2013, 2014,**
4 **2015, and 2016**

5 FOR the purpose of authorizing the creation of a State Debt in the amount of One Billion,
6 Thirteen Million, Two Hundred Sixty–Seven Thousand Dollars (\$1,013,267,000), the
7 proceeds to be used for certain necessary building, construction, demolition,
8 planning, renovation, conversion, replacement, and capital equipment purchases of
9 the State, for acquiring certain real estate in connection therewith, and for grants to
10 certain subdivisions and other organizations for certain development and
11 improvement purposes, subject to certain requirements that certain matching funds
12 be provided and expended by certain dates; providing generally for the issuance and
13 sale of bonds evidencing the loan; authorizing the creation of State Debt in certain
14 years to be used for certain purposes; imposing a certain tax on all assessable
15 property in the State; requiring that certain grantees convey certain easements
16 under certain circumstances to the Maryland Historical Trust; providing that the
17 proceeds of certain loans must be expended or encumbered by a certain date;
18 authorizing the Board of Public Works, under certain circumstances, to approve
19 certain appropriations, notwithstanding certain technical differences; authorizing
20 certain unexpended appropriations in certain prior capital budgets and bond loans
21 to be expended for other public projects; altering certain requirements for certain
22 programs in certain prior capital budgets and bond loans; providing that the
23 authorizations of State Debt in certain prior capital budgets and bond loans be
24 reduced by certain amounts; requiring that certain projects be constructed at certain
25 locations; repealing certain requirements for certain appropriations; requiring the
26 Comptroller to make certain transfers, adjustments, and reconciliations; repealing
27 certain Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loan Preauthorization acts; specifying
28 the use of certain project funds; altering the authorized uses of certain grants;
29 altering the authorized purpose of certain grants; altering the authorized scope of
30 certain grants; altering the names of certain grantees; altering the matching fund
31 requirements of certain grants; extending the deadline for certain grantees to

29 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
30 That:

31 (1) The Board of Public Works may borrow money and incur indebtedness on
32 behalf of the State of Maryland through a State loan to be known as the Maryland
33 Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2017 in the total principal amount of \$1,013,267,000.
34 This loan shall be evidenced by the issuance, sale, and delivery of State general obligation
35 bonds authorized by a resolution of the Board of Public Works and issued, sold, and
36 delivered in accordance with §§ 8-117 through 8-124 and 8-131.2 of the State Finance and
37 Procurement Article.

1 (2) The bonds to evidence this loan or installments of this loan may be sold as a
2 single issue of bonds under § 8–122 of the State Finance and Procurement Article.

3 (3) The cash proceeds of the sale of the bonds shall be paid to the Treasurer and
4 first shall be applied to the payment of the expenses of issuing, selling, and delivering the
5 bonds, unless funds for this purpose are otherwise provided, and then shall be credited on
6 the books of the Comptroller and expended, on approval by the Board of Public Works, for
7 the following public purposes, including any applicable architects’ and engineers’ fees:

16 (1) all three of the criteria
17 specified above, the school
18 may receive up to \$100,000;

19 (2) two of the three criteria
20 specified above, the school
21 may receive up to \$75,000;
22 and

23 (3) one of the three criteria
24 specified above, the school
25 may receive up to \$25,000.

26 Further provided that if more eligible schools apply and qualify
27 for grants than the total authorizations, the Maryland State
28 Department of Education shall prorate the grants based on the
29 total authorization amount. Further provided that the funds
30 shall be administered by the Maryland State Department of
31 Education and the Interagency Committee on School
32 Construction 3,500,000

33 (D) Supplemental Capital Grant Program for Local School
34 Systems. Provide funds to local school systems with enrollment
35 growth that over the last 5 years exceeds 150% of the statewide
36 average or with 300 or more relocatable classrooms. These
37 funds shall be administered in accordance with § 5-313 of the
38 Education Article and can be used for federal E-rate-eligible
39 special construction such as fiber and broadband infrastructure
