1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Child Abuse – Sex Trafficking**
3 **(Protecting Victims of Sex Trafficking Act of 2017)**

4 FOR the purpose of altering the definition of “sexual abuse” in provisions of law relating to
5 child abuse to include the sex trafficking of a child by any individual; defining the
6 terms “sexual molestation or exploitation” and “sex trafficking” in provisions of law
7 relating to child abuse; making this Act an emergency measure; and generally
8 relating to child abuse and sex trafficking.

1 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
2 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

3 **Article – Family Law**

4 5–701.

5 **(X) “SEX TRAFFICKING” MEANS THE RECRUITMENT, HARBORING,**
6 **TRANSPORTATION, PROVISION, OBTAINING, PATRONIZING, OR SOLICITING OF A**
7 **CHILD FOR THE PURPOSE OF A COMMERCIAL SEX ACT.**

8 **[(x) (1)] (Y) “Sexual abuse” means any act that involves [sexual molestation**
9 **or exploitation of a child by]:**

10 **(1) SEXUAL MOLESTATION OR EXPLOITATION OF A CHILD BY** a parent
11 **or other person who has permanent or temporary care or custody or responsibility for**
12 **supervision of a child, or by any household or family member; OR**

13 **(2) SEX TRAFFICKING OF A CHILD BY ANY INDIVIDUAL.**

14 **[(2)] (Z) [“Sexual abuse”] “SEXUAL MOLESTATION OR EXPLOITATION”**
15 **includes:**

16 **[(i)] (1) allowing or encouraging a child to engage in:**

17 **[1.] (I) obscene photography, films, poses, or similar**
18 **activity;**

19 **[2.] (II) pornographic photography, films, poses, or similar**
20 **activity; or**

21 **[3.] (III) prostitution;**

22 **[(ii)] human trafficking;**

23 **(iii)] (2) incest;**

24 **[(iv)] (3) rape;**

25 **[(v)] (4) sexual offense in any degree;**

26 **[(vi)] (5) sodomy; and**

27 **[(vii)] (6) unnatural or perverted sexual practices.**

1 [(y)] (AA) “Unsubstantiated” means a finding that there is an insufficient amount
2 of evidence to support a finding of indicated or ruled out.

3 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency
4 measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety, has
5 been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the members elected to
6 each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is
7 enacted.
