House Bill 858 (Allegany County Delegation)

Judicial Proceedings

Allegany County - Sheriff's Deputies - Salary and Duties

This bill alters statutory provisions regarding sheriff's deputies in Allegany County by repealing a requirement that salaries must be at least \$2,400 each and instead establishing that salaries are to be determined by the sheriff's budget. It also specifies that *at least* one of the deputies must be assigned to execute process, orders, and directions for the juvenile court and to perform the other duties the sheriff assigns.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: None.

Local Effect: The bill alters outdated statutory provisions and does not impact Allegany County finances or operations.

Small Business Effect: None.

Analysis

Current Law: The Sheriff of Allegany County must appoint at least five deputies at salaries of at least \$2,400 each. One of these deputies must be assigned by the sheriff to execute process, orders, and directions for the juvenile court and to perform the other duties the sheriff assigns.
