2 **Annual Corrective Bill**

5 certain obsolete references; reorganizing certain sections of the Annotated Code;
6 ratifying certain corrections made by the publishers of the Annotated Code;
7 providing that this Act is not intended to affect any law other than to correct

15 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Drafter’s Notes contained
16 in this Act are not law and may not be considered to have been enacted as part of this Act.

17 SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the provisions of this Act are
18 intended solely to correct technical errors in the law and there is no intent to revive or
19 otherwise affect law that is the subject of other acts, whether those acts were signed by the
20 Governor prior to or after the signing of this Act.

21 SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the publishers of the
22 Annotated Code of Maryland, subject to the approval of the Department of Legislative
23 Services, shall make any changes in the text of the Annotated Code necessary to effectuate
24 any termination provision that was enacted by the General Assembly and has taken effect
25 or will take effect prior to October 1, 2018. Any enactment of the 2018 Session of the General
26 Assembly that negates or extends the effect of a previously enacted termination provision
27 shall prevail over the provisions of this section.

28 SECTION 6. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the publishers of the
29 Annotated Code of Maryland, in consultation with and subject to the approval of the
30 Department of Legislative Services, shall make nonsubstantive corrections to codification,
31 style, capitalization, punctuation, grammar, spelling, and any reference rendered incorrect
32 or obsolete by an Act of the General Assembly, with no further action required by the
33 General Assembly. The publishers shall adequately describe any such correction in an
34 editor’s note following the section affected.

1 SECTION 7. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That Section 2 of this Act shall take
2 effect contingent on the taking effect of Chapter 256 of the Acts of the General Assembly of
3 2017, and if Chapter 256 does not take effect, Section 2 of this Act shall be null and void
4 without the necessity of further action by the General Assembly.

5 SECTION 8. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency
6 measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety, has
7 been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the members elected to
8 each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and, except as provided in Section 7 of
9 this Act, shall take effect from the date it is enacted.
