## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Baltimore County – Superintendent of Schools – Prohibition on Other**  
3 **Employment**

4 FOR the purpose of prohibiting the Baltimore County Superintendent of Schools from  
5 engaging in other employment; providing for the application of this Act; and  
6 generally relating to the employment of the Baltimore County Superintendent of  
7 Schools.

8 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,  
9 Article – Education  
10 Section 4–202(b)  
11 Annotated Code of Maryland  
12 (2014 Replacement Volume and 2017 Supplement)

13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,  
14 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

15 **Article – Education**

16 4–202.

17 (b) (1) The salary of a county superintendent may not be decreased during the  
18 superintendent’s term of office.

19 (2) Each county superintendent shall devote full time to public school  
20 business.

21 **(3) IN BALTIMORE COUNTY, THE COUNTY SUPERINTENDENT MAY**  
22 **NOT ENGAGE IN OTHER EMPLOYMENT.**

**SENATE BILL 1105**

1           SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, pursuant to Article III, § 35  
2 of the Maryland Constitution, this Act may not be construed to extend or apply to the salary  
3 or compensation of the Baltimore County Superintendent of Schools while serving in a term  
4 of office beginning before the effective date of this Act, but the provisions of this Act  
5 concerning the salary or compensation of the Baltimore County Superintendent of Schools  
6 shall take effect at the beginning of the next following term of office. This limitation does  
7 not apply to an individual appointed or elected after the effective date of this Act to fill out  
8 an unexpired term.

9           SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July  
10 1, 2018.
