## Civil Actions - Family Caregiver Reimbursement

- FOR the purpose of authorizing a certain family caregiver to bring a civil action against a certain family member for reimbursement of reasonable expenses incurred to provide care and support to a family member in need; requiring an initial complaint filed in a certain action to include evidence of certain expenses; requiring a certain action to be filed within a certain time period; defining a certain term; and generally relating to civil actions for reimbursement of expenses incurred by family caregivers.

- 22 OLD AND IN NEED OF SUBSTANTIAL ASSISTANCE WITH DAILY LIVING ACTIVITIES.

- 1 (A) A FAMILY CAREGIVER MAY BRING A CIVIL ACTION FOR 2 REIMBURSEMENT OF REASONABLE EXPENSES INCURRED TO PROVIDE CARE AND 3 SUPPORT TO A FAMILY MEMBER IN NEED AGAINST:
- 4 (1) THE FAMILY MEMBER IN NEED; OR
- 5 (2) ANOTHER FAMILY MEMBER.
- 6 (B) AN INITIAL COMPLAINT FILED IN AN ACTION UNDER THIS SECTION
  7 SHALL INCLUDE EVIDENCE OF THE EXPENSES FOR WHICH REIMBURSEMENT IS
  8 SOUGHT.

- AN ACTION UNDER THIS SUBTITLE SHALL BE FILED WITHIN 10 YEARS AFTER
  THE DATE ON WHICH THE EXPENSES ARE INCURRED.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2019.
