A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Election Law – Early Voting Centers – Accessibility by Public Transportation

- 3 FOR the purpose of requiring that, in a county that has fixed-route public transportation
- 4 service, each early voting center be located within a certain distance of a public
- 5 transportation station or stop; providing for a delayed effective date; and generally
- 6 relating to early voting centers.
- 7 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

- 12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND.
- 13 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 14 Article Election Law
- 15 10-301.1.
- 16 (a) Except as provided under Title 9, Subtitle 3 of this article, during any 17 regularly scheduled primary or general election a voter may vote:
- 18 (1) in the voter's assigned precinct on election day; or
- 19 (2) at an early voting center in the voter's county of residence on any early voting day in accordance with this section.
- 21 (b) (1) Each county shall have at least one early voting center established in 22 the county as prescribed in this subsection.



- 1 A county with fewer than 125,000 registered voters shall have one early (2)2 voting center established in the county. 3 A county with more than 125,000 registered voters but fewer than 200,000 registered voters shall have three early voting centers established in the county. 4 A county with more than 200,000 registered voters but fewer than 5 6 300,000 registered voters shall have four early voting centers established in the county. 7 A county with more than 300,000 registered voters but fewer than 8 450,000 registered voters shall have seven early voting centers established in the county. 9 A county with more than 450,000 registered voters shall have eleven 10 early voting centers. 11 In addition to the early voting centers required in this subsection, each (7)12 county may establish one additional early voting center if the State Board, in collaboration 13 with the local board, and the governing body of the county agree to establish an additional 14 early voting center. No later than 6 months before a primary election, the State Board, in 15 collaboration with the local board in each county, shall designate each early voting center 16 17 in that county. 18 (d) Each early voting center shall be open for voting as follows: 19 (1) beginning the second Thursday before a primary or general election 20 through the Thursday before the election; and 21**(2)** during the following hours: 22in a presidential general election, during the hours between 238 a.m. and 8 p.m. each early voting day; and 24 in all other elections, during the hours between 10 a.m. and (ii) 8 p.m. each early voting day. 2526 Each early voting center shall: (e) 27 **(1)** IN A COUNTY THAT HAS FIXED-ROUTE PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION 28SERVICE, BE LOCATED NOT MORE THAN ONE-QUARTER MILE FROM A PUBLIC

(f) Beginning 30 days prior to each early voting period the State Board and each

- local board shall undertake steps to inform the public about early voting and the location of early voting centers in each county, including:
- 3 (1) a series of public service media announcements;
- 4 (2) mailings to all registered voters in each county; and
- 5 (3) other measures as appropriate.
- 6 (g) Except as expressly provided in this section, any provision of this article that 7 applies to voting on election day also applies to early voting.
- 8 (h) The State Board shall adopt regulations and guidelines in accordance with the 9 requirements of this section for the conduct of early voting.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 11 January 1, 2021.
