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## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Maryland National Guard – Tuition Assistance Program – Modifications**

3 FOR the purpose of increasing the percentage of tuition that may be reimbursed of the cost  
4 of in-State tuition for certain courses for any active National Guard member  
5 attending certain institutions; expanding the definition of “member” as it relates to  
6 who can receive tuition reimbursement to include any individual who holds a  
7 commission in the National Guard; and generally relating to tuition assistance for  
8 members of the Maryland National Guard.

9 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,  
10 Article – Public Safety  
11 Section 13–405  
12 Annotated Code of Maryland  
13 (2018 Replacement Volume and 2019 Supplement)

14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,  
15 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

16 **Article – Public Safety**

17 13–405.

18 (a) (1) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated.

19 (2) “Institution” means:

20 (i) any campus of the University System of Maryland, any  
21 community college established under Title 16 of the Education Article, Morgan State  
22 University, or St. Mary’s College;

1 (ii) any private institution of higher education that grants a member  
2 a tuition waiver of at least 50%;

3 (iii) any public postsecondary vocational–technical or trade school; or

4 (iv) any private postsecondary vocational–technical or trade school  
5 that grants a member a tuition waiver of at least 50%.

6 (3) “Member” means an individual who:

7 (i) is regularly enlisted in the National Guard; or

8 (ii) holds a commission in the National Guard [as:

9 1. an officer in the grade of major or below; or

10 2. a warrant officer].

11 (4) (i) “Tuition” means the basic instructional charge for  
12 undergraduate, graduate, professional, vocational–technical, and trade school credit  
13 courses and related fees at an institution.

14 (ii) “Tuition” does not include charges for self–supporting programs.

15 (b) (1) To the extent that funds are provided in the State budget, the  
16 Department may provide assistance equal to [50%] **100%** of the cost of in–State tuition for  
17 any regularly scheduled undergraduate credit course, graduate credit course, professional  
18 credit course, vocational–technical course, or trade course for any active member attending  
19 an institution who is certified as eligible by the Adjutant General.

20 (2) Subject to paragraph (5) of this subsection, a member who receives  
21 assistance under paragraph (1) of this subsection for an undergraduate credit,  
22 vocational–technical, or trade course shall remain an active member for at least 2 years  
23 following the completion of the course.

24 (3) Subject to paragraph (5) of this subsection, a member who receives  
25 assistance under paragraph (1) of this subsection for a graduate or professional credit  
26 course shall remain an active member for at least 4 years following the completion of the  
27 course.

28 (4) Subject to paragraph (5) of this subsection, if a member receives  
29 assistance under paragraph (1) of this subsection, and is a member of a unit that has been  
30 disbanded on or after September 1, 2013, due to budgetary cuts, Base Realignment and  
31 Closure, or any other reason, the member may satisfy the requirements of paragraph (2) or  
32 paragraph (3) of this subsection by transferring to another active duty, reserve, or National  
33 Guard Unit in the State or in another state.

1                   (5) If a member who receives assistance under paragraph (1) of this  
2 subsection is offered early separation by the military following the disbanding of the  
3 member's unit due to budget cuts, Base Realignment and Closure, or any other reason, the  
4 member is excused from the requirements of paragraph (2) or paragraph (3) of this  
5 subsection.

6           (c)   (1) The Adjutant General may not certify a member as eligible unless the  
7 member is:

8                   (i) enlisted and has at least 24 months remaining to serve on the  
9 current enlistment of the member; or

10                   (ii) an officer or warrant officer and agrees in writing to serve for a  
11 minimum of 24 months.

12           (2) The 24-month requirement runs from the first day of classes for the  
13 semester.

14           (d) If a recipient of tuition assistance under this section is discharged from the  
15 National Guard for a reason designated by the Adjutant General, the assistance terminates  
16 and the member shall reimburse the Department the amount of tuition assistance received  
17 for that semester within 30 days of discharge.

18           SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July  
19 1, 2020.
