1 A Senate Joint Resolution concerning

2 **Congressional Action – Surprise Billing – Air Ambulance**

3 FOR the purpose of urging the U.S. Congress to pass legislation that prohibits the balance  
4 billing of consumers by certain air ambulances; providing that a copy of this  
5 resolution be sent by the Department of Legislative Services to certain individuals;  
6 and generally relating to balance billing of consumers by air ambulances.

7 WHEREAS, A 2019 report by the U.S. Government Accountability Office stated that  
8 approximately two-thirds of air ambulance transports were out-of-network in 2017; and

9 WHEREAS, The same report stated that such out-of-network transports may result  
10 in the balance billing of a consumer for charges not covered by the consumer's insurance  
11 carrier; and

12 WHEREAS, Maryland consumers are at risk of being balance billed by  
13 out-of-network air ambulances; and

14 WHEREAS, In 2019, the Health Care Cost Institute reported that the average price  
15 of an air ambulance trip increased substantially from 2008 to 2017, rising 144% (from  
16 \$11,414 in 2008 to \$27,894 in 2017) for helicopters and 166% (from \$15,684 in 2008 to  
17 \$41,674 in 2017) for airplanes; and

18 WHEREAS, The cost of the balance bills can be catastrophic to the finances of  
19 individuals and families; and

20 WHEREAS, The federal 1978 Airline Deregulation Act preempts state-level  
21 economic regulation of air carriers, which includes air ambulances; and

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1 WHEREAS, The General Assembly of Maryland is unable to protect Maryland  
2 consumers from balance billing by air ambulances; now, therefore, be it

3 RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the General  
4 Assembly of Maryland urges the U.S. Congress to pass legislation that prohibits the  
5 balance billing of consumers by air ambulances that do not participate in a consumer's  
6 insurance carrier network; and be it further
