## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Public Safety - Task Force on Missing Persons

- 3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Task Force on Missing Persons; providing for the 4 composition, chair, and staffing of the Task Force; prohibiting a member of the Task 5 Force from receiving certain compensation, but authorizing the reimbursement of 6 certain expenses; requiring the Task Force to study and make recommendations 7 regarding certain matters; requiring the Task Force to report its findings and 8 recommendations to the Governor and the General Assembly on or before a certain 9 date; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to the Task 10 Force on Missing Persons.
- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

- one member of the Senate of Maryland, appointed by the President of the Senate:
