A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **State Superintendent of Schools – Qualifications and Senate Confirmation**

3 FOR the purpose of requiring that the State Superintendent of Schools be appointed with
4 the advice and consent of the Senate; prohibiting the appointment of an individual
5 as State Superintendent if the individual is, or during a certain time period was, a
6 member of the State Board of Education; making this Act an emergency measure;
7 and generally relating to the State Superintendent of Schools.

18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

19 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

20 **Article – Education**

21 2–301.

22 There is a State Superintendent of Schools in the Department.

23 2–302.

1 (a) The State Superintendent shall be appointed by the State Board, **WITH THE**
2 **ADVICE AND CONSENT OF THE SENATE**, for a term of 4 years beginning on July 1 after
3 the Superintendent's appointment and serves until a successor is appointed and qualifies.

4 (b) The State Board shall fix the Superintendent's salary and pay it from the
5 appropriation for the expenses and maintenance of the Department.

6 (c) The State Superintendent [shall]:

7 (1) [Be] **MUST BE** an experienced and competent educator;

8 (2) [Be] **MUST BE** a graduate of an accredited college or university;

9 (3) [Have] **MUST HAVE** at least 2 years of special academic and
10 professional graduate preparation in an accredited college or university; [and]

11 (4) [Have] **MUST HAVE** at least 7 years of experience in teaching and
12 administration; **AND**

13 **(5) MAY NOT BE A CURRENT MEMBER OF THE STATE BOARD OR HAVE**
14 **BEEN A MEMBER OF THE STATE BOARD AT ANY TIME DURING THE YEAR**
15 **IMMEDIATELY PRECEDING THE APPOINTMENT.**

16 (d) (1) The State Board may remove the State Superintendent for:

17 (i) Immorality;

18 (ii) Misconduct in office;

19 (iii) Insubordination;

20 (iv) Incompetency; or

21 (v) Willful neglect of duty.

22 (2) Before removing the State Superintendent, the State Board shall send
23 the Superintendent a copy of the charges against the Superintendent and give the
24 Superintendent an opportunity within 10 days to request a hearing.

25 (3) If the State Superintendent requests a hearing within the 10-day
26 period:

27 (i) The State Board promptly shall hold a hearing, but a hearing
28 may not be set within 10 days after the State Board sends the State Superintendent a notice
29 of the hearing; and

1 (ii) The State Superintendent shall have an opportunity to be heard
2 publicly before the State Board in the Superintendent's own defense, in person or by
3 counsel.

4 (e) The State Board shall appoint a new State Superintendent to fill a vacancy in
5 that office for the remainder of the unexpired term.

6 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency
7 measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety, has
8 been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the members elected to
9 each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is
10 enacted.
