1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Maryland Veterans Service Animal Program – Definitions**

3 FOR the purpose of defining the terms “service dog”, “support dog”, and “therapy horse” for
4 the purposes of the provisions of law governing the Maryland Veterans Service
5 Animal Program in the Department of Veterans Affairs; and generally relating to
6 the Maryland Veterans Service Animal Program in the Department of Veterans
7 Affairs.

1 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
2 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

3 **Article – State Government**

4 9–957.

5 (a) (1) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated.

6 (2) “Eligible veteran” means an individual who:

7 (i) served on active duty in:

8 1. the armed forces of the United States;

9 2. the National Guard; or

10 3. a reserve component of the armed forces of the United
11 States;

12 (ii) served in a capacity other than for training;

13 (iii) was discharged or released under conditions other than
14 dishonorable; and

15 (iv) 1. is a resident of the State; or

16 2. receives treatment or care from a U.S. Department of
17 Veterans Affairs or U.S. Department of Defense medical facility in the State.

18 (3) “Fund” means the Maryland Veterans Service Animal Program Fund
19 established under subsection (f) of this section.

20 (4) “Nonprofit training entity” means a corporation, a foundation, or any
21 other legal entity that:

22 (i) is qualified under § 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code;

23 (ii) 1. engages in the training of service dogs or support dogs for
24 use by veterans; or

25 2. uses trained therapy horses for interaction with veterans;
26 and

27 (iii) has been selected by the Department to provide services under
28 this section.

1 (5) "Program" means the Maryland Veterans Service Animal Program
2 established under subsection (b) of this section.

3 (6) "Program participant" means an eligible veteran who participates in
4 the Program.

5 (7) **"SERVICE DOG" MEANS A DOG THAT IS INDIVIDUALLY TRAINED TO
6 DO WORK OR PERFORM TASKS FOR THE BENEFIT OF AN INDIVIDUAL WITH A
7 DISABILITY, INCLUDING PHYSICAL, SENSORY, PSYCHIATRIC, INTELLECTUAL, OR
8 OTHER MENTAL DISABILITY.**

9 (8) "Successful Program participant" means a Program participant who
10 successfully completes the training or therapy protocol specified by a nonprofit training
11 entity.

12 (9) **"SUPPORT DOG" MEANS A DOG THAT IS INDIVIDUALLY TRAINED
13 AND THAT SERVES AS AN EMOTIONAL SUPPORT OR THERAPY ANIMAL THAT A
14 MEDICAL PROFESSIONAL, WITHIN THE MEDICAL PROFESSIONAL'S SCOPE OF
15 PRACTICE, HAS DETERMINED PROVIDES BENEFIT FOR AN INDIVIDUAL WITH A
16 SENSORY, PSYCHIATRIC, INTELLECTUAL, OR OTHER MENTAL DISABILITY.**

17 (10) **"THERAPY HORSE" INCLUDES A HORSE DETERMINED
18 APPROPRIATE FOR INTERACTIONS WITH VETERANS BY A STABLE LICENSED BY THE
19 STATE THAT:**

20 (I) **IS A PROFESSIONAL ASSOCIATION OF THERAPEUTIC
21 HORSEMANSHIP, INTERNATIONAL (PATH, INTL.) PREMIER ACCREDITED MEMBER
22 CENTER; OR**

23 (II) **HAS EQUINE ASSISTED GROWTH AND LEARNING
24 ASSOCIATION (EAGALA) CERTIFIED PROFESSIONALS WHO PROVIDE SERVICES TO
25 VETERANS.**

26 (b) There is a Maryland Veterans Service Animal Program in the Department.

27 (c) The purposes of the Program are to:

28 (1) refer eligible veterans who inquire about participation in the Program
29 to one or more nonprofit training entities;

30 (2) provide additional funding mechanisms to assist veterans participating
31 in the Program;

1 (3) encourage successful Program participants to assist in outreach and
2 referral of other eligible veterans who could benefit from participation in the Program;

3 (4) assist in the reduction of the Maryland veteran suicide rate; and

4 (5) identify potential capital projects and services to facilitate more
5 services for veterans in the State.

6 (d) (1) The Department shall select at least one nonprofit training entity to:

7 (i) implement a training or therapy protocol for the purposes of the
8 Program that will teach each Program participant methodologies, strategies, and
9 techniques for:

10 1. partnering with service dogs or support dogs; or

11 2. interacting with therapy horses;

12 (ii) select qualified Program participants from those eligible
13 veterans referred to the nonprofit entity under the Program;

14 (iii) select an appropriate service dog, support dog, or therapy horse,
15 as applicable, for each Program participant;

16 (iv) facilitate each Program participant's training or therapy using
17 the nonprofit training entity's training or therapy protocol; and

18 (v) unless the nonprofit training entity uses trained therapy horses,
19 partner each successful Program participant with the service dog or support dog on the
20 Program participant's successful completion of the nonprofit training entity's training
21 protocol.

22 (2) To be eligible for selection under paragraph (1) of this subsection, a
23 nonprofit entity must:

24 (i) be based in the State;

25 (ii) serve the needs of the veteran population in the State; and

26 (iii) generate its own revenue and reinvest the proceeds of that
27 revenue in the growth and development of its programs.

28 (e) (1) A nonprofit training entity may disqualify a Program participant from
29 participation in the Program if the nonprofit training entity determines that the Program
30 participant's involvement in the Program:

- 1 (i) presents a danger to the Program participant's mental or
2 physical well-being;
- 3 (ii) has caused or may potentially cause harm to others, an animal,
4 or property;
- 5 (iii) presents a danger to the service dog's, support dog's, or therapy
6 horse's mental or physical well-being; or
- 7 (iv) does not meet the training requirement of the nonprofit.
- 8 (2) A Program participant may discontinue involvement in the Program for
9 any reason.
- 10 (f) (1) There is a Maryland Veterans Service Animal Program Fund.
- 11 (2) The Department shall use revenue from the Fund to pay a nonprofit
12 training entity.
- 13 (3) Revenue from the Fund may be used only to pay:
- 14 (i) a nonprofit training entity; and
- 15 (ii) administrative costs of the Program.
- 16 (4) The Secretary, or the Secretary's designee, shall administer the Fund.
- 17 (5) (i) The Fund is a special, nonlapsing fund that is not subject to §
18 7-302 of the State Finance and Procurement Article.
- 19 (ii) The State Treasurer shall hold the Fund separately, and the
20 Comptroller shall account for the Fund.
- 21 (6) The Fund consists of:
- 22 (i) revenue collected by the Department in the form of donations to
23 the Program;
- 24 (ii) money appropriated in the State budget to the Fund; and
- 25 (iii) any other money from any other source accepted for the benefit
26 of the Fund.
- 27 (7) The State Treasurer shall invest the money of the Fund in the same
28 manner as other State money may be invested.

1 (8) Any interest earnings of the Fund shall be credited to the General Fund
2 of the State.

3 (9) Expenditures from the Fund may be made only in accordance with the
4 State budget.

5 (10) Money expended from the Fund is supplemental to and is not intended
6 to take the place of funding that otherwise would be appropriated for the Program.

7 (g) (1) For the purpose of implementing this section, the Department may
8 accept gifts or grants for donation to the Fund.

9 (2) On or before October 1, 2018, and each October 1 thereafter, the
10 Department shall post and maintain on its website a list containing the names of all
11 persons who have donated to the Fund in the previous year and have authorized the
12 Department to publish their names on its website.

13 (h) The Department shall adopt regulations to implement this section, including
14 regulations establishing procedures for the Department to:

15 (1) promote the Program to eligible veterans through the Department's
16 outreach methods;

17 (2) refer eligible veterans to selected nonprofit entities;

18 (3) receive donations for the Fund through a link placed in a prominent
19 location on the Department's website; and

20 (4) use revenue from the Fund to pay selected nonprofit entities for services
21 that are provided through the Program.

22 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
23 October 1, 2021.
