2 **Frederick County – Barbershop and Beauty Salon Beer and Wine Licenses –**
3 **Alterations**

4 FOR the purpose of altering a certain limitation on the amount of beer that a holder of a
5 barbershop or beauty salon beer and wine license in Frederick County may provide
6 to a certain customer for on–premises consumption; and generally relating to
7 alcoholic beverages licenses in Frederick County.

18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
19 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

20 **Article – Alcoholic Beverages**

4 (a) There is a barbershop beer and wine license.

5 (b) The Board may issue the license to a holder of a barbershop permit under §
6 4-501 of the Business Occupations and Professions Article.

7 (c) The license authorizes the license holder to provide no more than 5 ounces of
8 [beer or] wine by the glass **OR 12 OUNCES OF BEER** for on-premises consumption by a
9 barbershop customer:

10 (1) when the customer is provided a service described in § 4-101(l) of the
11 Business Occupations and Professions Article; or

12 (2) while the customer is attending a fund-raising event at the barbershop
13 for which the Department of Permits and Inspections, if required, has issued a permit.

14 (d) The license may not be transferred to another location.

15 (e) The license holder may provide beer and wine for on-premises consumption
16 during normal business hours but not later than 9 p.m.

17 (f) The establishment for which a barbershop license is issued is subject to the
18 alcohol awareness training requirements under § 4-505 of this article, subject to § 20-1903
19 of this title.

20 (g) The annual license fee is \$100.

21 20-1002.

22 (a) There is a beauty salon beer and wine license.

23 (b) The Board may issue the license to a holder of a beauty salon permit under §
24 5-501 of the Business Occupations and Professions Article.

25 (c) The license authorizes the license holder to provide no more than 5 ounces of
26 [beer or] wine by the glass **OR 12 OUNCES OF BEER** for on-premises consumption by a
27 beauty salon customer:

28 (1) when the customer is provided a cosmetology service described in §
29 5-101(n)(1) of the Business Occupations and Professions Article; or

30 (2) while the customer is attending a fund-raising event at the beauty

1 salon for which the Department of Permits and Inspections, if required, has issued a permit.

2 (d) The license may not be transferred to another location.

3 (e) The license holder may provide beer and wine for on-premises consumption
4 during normal business hours but not later than 9 p.m.

5 (f) The establishment for which a beauty salon license is issued is subject to the
6 alcohol awareness training requirements under § 4-505 of this article, subject to § 20-1903
7 of this title.

8 (g) The annual license fee is \$100.

9 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July
10 1, 2021.
