10. Description and Purpose of Organization (Limit length to visible area)		
<p>The Peerless Rens Club stands as a monument to African-American culture and heritage in the Eastport neighborhood of Annapolis, MD. The club's origins lie in a group of African-American men who in 1948 built a community space where African-Americans could safely gather, socialize and support one another without fear of discrimination during that time. Over the past 70+ years, the club has provided a space for community gatherings from musical events, family celebrations, and balls, but also supported its neighbors through scholarships, donations of food baskets and school supplies to families in need.</p>		

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

The project will be used for capital improvements to the Peerless Rens Club that will 1.) Ensure structural integrity and preservation of the building and 2.) Increase its functionality and accessibility to the broader community, with the goal of reestablishing it as a community cultural resource center and gathering space in Eastport. Specifically, funds will be used to strengthen the foundation of the building and roof. Funds will also be used to make improvements to the exterior of the building which will include installing ADA accommodations, replacing doors, installing signage telling the story of the building's history, and updating the patio to increase its accessibility and usability, particularly during the pandemic. The remaining funds will be used for interior repairs to the floors and kitchen.
