10. Description and Purpose of Organization (Limit length to visible area)		
<p>Established in 1794, the Town of Brookeville was incorporated in 1808 as a self-governing municipality with three elected Commissioners. The historically significant Town is listed in the National Register of Historic Places and is a designated Montgomery County Historic District. Traditionally, Brookeville was a thriving market community. On August 26, 1814, Brookeville was the U.S. Capital for a Day when President Madison fled the British invasion of Washington, DC. Today, Brookeville is a quaint, mostly residential community, with a church, a restored one-room Schoolhouse, a restored Brookeville Academy which houses the Town Government and is used as a community center, and a few small businesses (mostly home-based). The Town focuses resources on providing services for residents and preserving its unique history to share with the surrounding communities.</p>

The purpose of this project is planning, design, engineering, construction, and capital equipping for improvements to the Town of Brookeville roadways. This work includes road resurfacing, curb/gutter and sidewalk replacement, traffic calming measures, stormwater management, street lighting, landscaping, signage and other public space improvements. The project focuses on safety of motor vehicles, bicyclists and pedestrians for the Town Residents and local Commuter traffic.
