House Bill 389 (Delegate Hill)
Health and Government Operations

General Provisions - State Song - Repeal and Competition

This bill repeals the State song of Maryland and requires the Maryland State Arts Council (MSAC) to develop a plan for and conduct a State song competition, as specified. By December 1, 2021, MSAC must report its recommendations to the Governor and specified committees of the General Assembly on the finalists of the competition and may recommend that one of the finalists be designated as the State song or no State song be designated. **The bill takes effect July 1, 2021; provisions pertaining to the competition terminate June 30, 2022.**

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: MSAC can handle the bill's requirements with existing resources. Revenues are not affected.

Local Effect: None.

Small Business Effect: None.

Analysis

Bill Summary: MSAC must:

- conduct a State song competition in which contestants may submit a song about the State of Maryland and include and accept as entries proposed replacement songs from the October 2015 report of the State Song Advisory Group that are designated in specified legislation;

- develop rules and guidelines for the competition and criteria for the selection of a winner or finalists that includes specified elements;
- select no more than three finalists, giving preference to State residents; and
- promote the competition on the MSAC website and through media outlets.

Current Law: Since the adoption of the Maryland State Flag in 1904 and the adoption of the Black-eyed Susan as the State flower in 1918, the State has adopted many official symbols, as shown in **Exhibit 1**. The official State song is James Ryder Randall’s “Maryland! My Maryland!” set to the tune of “Lauriger Horatius.”
