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## CHAPTER \_\_\_\_\_

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Department of Legislative Services – Collection of Information Related to**  
3 **Public Safety, Criminal Justice, Corrections, and Juvenile Services**

4 FOR the purpose of requiring the Department of State Police to collect, analyze, and  
5 disseminate, and law enforcement agencies to submit to the Department of State  
6 Police, certain information about law enforcement employees; altering the  
7 information that law enforcement agencies are required to submit to the Maryland  
8 Police Training and Standards Commission related to serious officer-involved  
9 incidents; specifying the required contents of a certain use of force incident report;  
10 altering the date by which law enforcement agencies are required to submit to the  
11 Commission certain data related to police officers' use of force; requiring the  
12 Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services, the Department of State  
13 Police, the ~~Maryland Police Training and Standards~~ Commission, and the Governor's  
14 Office of Crime Prevention, Youth, and Victim Services to provide certain  
15 information related to public safety and criminal justice in a certain manner to the  
16 Department of Legislative Services on or before a certain date each year; requiring  
17 the Department of Legislative Services and the Department of State Police to enter  
18 into a certain memorandum of understanding related to a data sharing agreement  
19 for information contained in certain reports, a certain work plan, and an update on  
20 the status of compliance by law enforcement agencies with the National  
21 Incident-Based Reporting System; requiring the Department of Legislative Services  
22 and the Department of Juvenile Services to enter into a certain memorandum of  
23 understanding relating to the provision of certain reports and the development of a  
24 certain work plan; and generally relating to information required to be submitted to  
25 the Department of Legislative Services.

 2 WITH § 2-307(A)(2) OF THE PUBLIC SAFETY ARTICLE.

3 (2) ON OR BEFORE AUGUST 1, 2022, THE DEPARTMENT OF STATE  
 4 POLICE AND THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ENTER INTO A MEMORANDUM OF  
 5 UNDERSTANDING, THE TERMS OF WHICH SHALL INCLUDE:

6 (I) A DATA SHARING AGREEMENT FOR ALL INFORMATION  
 7 COLLECTED IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 2-307 OF THE PUBLIC SAFETY ARTICLE;

8 (II) A WORK PLAN FOR ACCESS TO COLLECTED DATA FOR  
 9 RESEARCH AND STATISTICAL ANALYSIS PURPOSES;

10 (III) A LISTING OF ALL DATA FIELDS COLLECTED FOR THE CRIME  
 11 IN MARYLAND REPORT AND THE HATE BIAS REPORT; AND

12 (IV) AN UPDATE ON THE STATUS OF COMPLIANCE WITH THE

19 SERVICES AND THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ENTER INTO A MEMORANDUM OF  
20 UNDERSTANDING, THE TERMS OF WHICH SHALL INCLUDE:

21           (1) THE PROVISION OF VARIOUS CUSTOM REPORTS TO THE  
22 DEPARTMENT, INCLUDING INFORMATION, DE-IDENTIFIED AND DISAGGREGATED

7 (a) **(1) Each law enforcement agency shall require a police officer who was**  
8 **involved in a use of force incident in the line of duty to file an incident report regarding the**  
9 **use of force by the end of the officer’s shift unless the officer is disabled.**

10 **(2) THE INCIDENT REPORT REQUIRED UNDER PARAGRAPH (1) OF**  
11 **THIS SUBSECTION SHALL INCLUDE:**

12 **(I) THE TYPE OF ENCOUNTER;**

13 **(II) THE TYPE OF FORCE USED;**

14 **(III) THE LOCATION OF THE INCIDENT WHERE FORCE WAS USED;**

15 **(IV) WHETHER THE INDIVIDUAL AGAINST WHOM FORCE WAS**  
16 **USED WAS ARRESTED;**

17 **(V) WHAT CHARGES, IF ANY, FOR WHICH THE INDIVIDUAL**  
18 **AGAINST WHOM FORCE WAS USED WAS ARRESTED;**

19 **(VI) WHETHER THE INDIVIDUAL AGAINST WHOM FORCE WAS**  
20 **USED REQUESTED OR REQUIRED MEDICAL CARE;**

21 **(VII) WHETHER THE LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER REQUESTED**  
22 **OR REQUIRED MEDICAL CARE; AND**

23 **(VIII) DEMOGRAPHIC INFORMATION ABOUT ANY INDIVIDUALS**  
24 **AGAINST WHOM FORCE WAS USED AND ANY LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER INVOLVED**  
25 **IN THE INCIDENT, INCLUDING RACE, ETHNICITY, GENDER, AND AGE.**

26 (b) **(1) On or before [March 1] JULY 1, 2023, AND JULY 1 each year**  
27 **THEREAFTER, each law enforcement agency shall submit to the Maryland Police Training**  
28 **and Standards Commission the [number of use of force complaints made against its police**  
29 **officers during] AGGREGATE DATA OF POLICE OFFICERS’ USE OF FORCE REPORTED**  
30 **IN ACCORDANCE WITH SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION FOR the previous calendar**



1 year, aggregated by numbers of complaints administratively charged, not charged,  
2 unfounded, and exonerated.

3 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That Section 2 of this Act shall take  
4 effect July 1, 2022, the effective date of Chapter 59 of the Acts of the General Assembly of  
5 2021. If the effective date of Chapter 59 is amended, Section 2 of this Act shall take effect  
6 on the taking effect of Chapter 59.

7 SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, except as provided in Section  
8 3 of this Act, this Act shall take effect July 1, 2022.
