A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Alcoholic Beverages – Manufacturer’s Licenses and Off-Site Permits – Sunset**
3 **Extension**

4 FOR the purpose of extending the termination date for various provisions relating to
5 alcoholic beverages manufacturer’s licenses and off-site permits, including
6 provisions repealing specified permits and establishing a manufacturer off-site
7 permit and brewery special event permit, altering the fee structure for several
8 manufacturer’s licenses, authorizing holders of certain manufacturer’s licenses to
9 sell and deliver and to directly ship their own alcoholic beverages products to certain
10 individuals under certain circumstances, altering the limitations of the Class 7
11 limited beer wholesaler’s license, and altering the privileges associated with certain
12 licenses; and generally relating to alcoholic beverages, manufacturer’s licenses, and
13 off-site permits.

20 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
21 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
