<p>Howard County Government via the Howard County Department of Recreation and Parks. The Howard County Department of Recreation and Parks is responsible for the stewardship of over 9,800 acres of public lands; the maintenance and operation of more than 35 parks, 4 natural resource areas, 26 historic sites, 3 community centers, a nature center, an athletic center, and various other facilities; and offering over 7,500 public recreation programs. The mission of the Department is to responsibly manage natural resources; provide excellent parks, facilities, and recreation opportunities for the community; and ensure the highest quality of life for current and future generations.</p>

Howard County is requesting a \$200,000.00 Bond Bill Grant to design, construct, renovate, install, and equip a replacement playground with safety surfacing at the Centennial Park - West Area in Ellicott City, Maryland. The existing playground is the original playground to the site and is now nearly 30 years old, well exceeding its useful life. The replacement of the existing structures and surfacing creates an opportunity to improve public accessibility, safety, and enjoyment at the Centennial Park - West Area.
