10. Description and Purpose of Organization (Limit length to visible area)		
<p>The City of Hyattsville is one of 27 incorporated municipalities within Prince George's County, Maryland. It was established in 1886 and adopted its present Charter in 1983 and currently has a population of approximately 18,000 people. Located just minutes from Washington , D.C., 28 miles from downtown Baltimore and 24 miles west of Annapolis, the City is easily accessible by two metro rail stations within three commercial corridors. The executive offices of the City are located at the Municipal Building, 4310 Gallatin Street. City operations include the Police Department, Department of Public Works, Community Services and Community Development all of which provide services to its residents and ensures that the community is publicly safe and structurally sound.</p>		

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

In 2021, Council approved changing the name of the park formerly known as Magruder Park to David C. Driskell Community Park. The decision to change the parks name came after it was discovered that the parks former namesake had gifted the land with a racist restrictive covenant. The new name honors David Driskell, a Hyattsville resident and a world-renowned artist, scholar, and curator; specifically recognized for his support of African American art. This request is to fund Phase 2 of the project, which includes: Art walk (within existing trailways) with free-standing art, lighting and informational markers; interactive attendee displays; video production of artists life/work/commitment to diversity; Driskell art applications to walkways/drive/tennis and basketball courts, light-post banners, entry and building signage; artist-commissioned bench; and mural for community center building.
