The Town of Riverdale Park is a municipal organization.		

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

The Town's Public Works building and operation is located at the end (a cul-de-sac) of the 5000 block of Queensbury Road. Preserving safe passage for pedestrians and securing heavy vehicles and equipment used by Public Works are the project goals. The project is the design and construction of a sidewalk from the Riverdale Elementary School property to open space located off the cul-de-sac, decorative fencing to separate pedestrians from the roadway, lighting improvements, and a crossroad gate at the public works building to secure the back end of the street. Estimated cost: \$305,000. This project will provide a safe passageway for pedestrians and remove the current safety conflict between pedestrians and the heavy equipment used by Public Works and Police, while also improving the security and safety of the equipment used to provide essential municipal services.
