Ways and Means

Motor Fuel Taxes - Tax-Free Period

This emergency bill temporarily eliminates certain motor fuel taxes during a 30-day period beginning with the effective date of the bill.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: Special fund revenues decrease by \$93.6 million in FY 2022 due to a reduction in motor fuel tax revenues. Supplemental Budget No. 2 provides \$100.0 million in general fund revenues to offset the loss in special funds resulting from the bill.

Local Effect: The bill does not materially affect local government finances.

Small Business Effect: Small business suppliers and consumers of motor fuels may benefit from the proposed reduction in motor fuel taxes.

Analysis

Current Law: As of July 1, 2021, the per gallon motor fuel tax rate is equal to 36.1 cents (gasoline and clean-burning fuel), 36.85 cents (special fuel/diesel), and 7.0 cents (aviation and turbine fuel).

After distribution to an administrative cost account, net motor fuel taxes are distributed to the TTF, Chesapeake and Atlantic Coastal Bays 2010 Trust fund (2010 Trust Fund), and Waterway Improvement Fund. A portion of TTF revenues is used to provide capital transportation grants to local governments.

State Fiscal Effect: The bill temporarily eliminates certain motor fuel taxes during a 30-day period beginning with the effective date of the bill. **Exhibit 1** shows the fiscal impact of the bill.
