Election Law - Insufficient Number of Candidates for a Primary Election

- 3 FOR the purpose of requiring the State Board of Elections to extend the filing deadline for 4 a primary election if, at any time during a certain period of time immediately 5 preceding the filing deadline, the number of candidates for a party is less than the 6 number of nominations the party is allowed for the office; requiring the State central 7 committee of a political party to select candidates for Governor and Lieutenant 8 Governor to fill vacancies in candidacy for a primary election under certain 9 circumstances; and generally relating to an insufficient number of candidates for a primary election. 10

- 21 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
- 22 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 23 Article Election Law
- 24 5–303.

- 1 (a) Except as provided in subsections (b), (c), and (d) of this section **AND § 5–303.1** 2 **OF THIS SUBTITLE**:
- 3 (1) in the year in which the Governor is elected, a certificate of candidacy 4 shall be filed not later than 9 p.m. on the last Tuesday in February in the year in which the 5 primary election will be held; and
- 6 (2) for any other regularly scheduled election, a certificate of candidacy 7 shall be filed not later than 9 p.m. on the 95th day before the day on which the primary 8 election will be held.
- 9 (b) Except as provided in subsection (d) of this section, a certificate of candidacy for an office to be filled by a special election under this article shall be received and filed in the office of the appropriate board not later than 5 p.m. on the first Monday that is 3 weeks or 21 days after the issuance of the proclamation by the Governor for the special primary election.
- 14 (c) Except as provided in subsection (d) of this section, the certificate of candidacy for the election of a write—in candidate shall be filed by the earlier of:
- 16 (1) 7 days after a total expenditure of at least \$51 is made to promote the candidacy by a campaign finance entity of the candidate; or
- 18 (2) 5 p.m. on the 7th day preceding the start of early voting for which the 19 certificate is filed.
- 20 (d) The certificate of candidacy for a special election of a write—in candidate shall 21 be filed by the earlier of:
- 22 (1) 7 days after a total expenditure of at least \$51 is made to promote the 23 candidacy by any authorized candidate campaign committee of the candidate; or
- 24 (2) 5 p.m. on the 7th day preceding the start of voting at a precinct polling place or, if the election is being conducted by mail, the voting center established under § 9–503 of this article for which the certificate is filed.

- 28 (A) THE STATE BOARD SHALL EXTEND THE FILING DEADLINE FOR A
 29 PRIMARY ELECTION FOR AN OFFICE OTHER THAN THE OFFICE OF GOVERNOR OR
 30 LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR UNTIL 7 DAYS AFTER THE DEADLINE SPECIFIED IN § 5–303
 31 OF THIS SUBTITLE, IF AT ANY TIME DURING THE 48–HOUR PERIOD IMMEDIATELY
 32 PRECEDING THE FILING DEADLINE SPECIFIED IN § 5–303 OF THIS SUBTITLE:
- 33 (1) AN UNOPPOSED CANDIDATE DIES, IS DISQUALIFIED, OR 34 WITHDRAWS; OR

- 1 (2) THE NUMBER OF CANDIDATES FOR A POLITICAL PARTY THAT
 2 HAVE FILED A CERTIFICATE OF CANDIDACY FOR THE OFFICE IS LESS THAN THE
 3 NUMBER OF NOMINATIONS THE POLITICAL PARTY IS ALLOWED FOR THE OFFICE.
- 4 (B) THE STATE BOARD SHALL EXTEND THE FILING DEADLINE FOR THE 5 PRIMARY ELECTION FOR THE OFFICES OF GOVERNOR AND LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR 6 UNTIL 7 DAYS AFTER THE DEADLINE SPECIFIED IN § 5–303 OF THIS SUBTITLE, IF 7 DURING THE 48–HOUR PERIOD IMMEDIATELY PRECEDING THE FILING DEADLINE 8 SPECIFIED IN § 5–303 OF THIS SUBTITLE:
- 9 (1) UNOPPOSED CANDIDATES FOR THE OFFICES OF GOVERNOR AND LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR BOTH DIE, ARE DISQUALIFIED, OR WITHDRAW; OR
- 11 (2) NO CANDIDATE FOR THE POLITICAL PARTY HAS FILED A
 12 CERTIFICATE OF CANDIDACY FOR EITHER OF THE OFFICES OF GOVERNOR AND
 13 LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR.

- 15 (a) Subject to § 5–402 of this title, an individual who has filed a certificate of candidacy may withdraw the candidacy by filing a certificate of withdrawal on the form 17 prescribed by the State Board within 10 days after the **INITIAL** filing date established under § 5–303 of this title.
- 19 (b) An individual who has filed a certificate of candidacy for the special election 20 to fill a vacancy for Representative in Congress may withdraw the certificate on the 21 prescribed form within 2 days after the filing date established in the proclamation issued 22 by the Governor.
- 23 5-504.
- 24 (a) If a certificate of withdrawal is filed under this subtitle:
- 25 (1) the certificate of candidacy to which the certificate of withdrawal 26 relates is void;
- 27 (2) the name of the candidate may not be submitted to the voters for 28 nomination and election to the office to which the certificate relates unless the individual 29 files a new certificate of candidacy within the time limit prescribed for filing; and
- 30 (3) except as provided in \S 5–402 of this title, the filing fee for the certificate 31 of candidacy may not be refunded.

- 1 (b) Except for the offices of Governor and Lieutenant Governor, the name of any individual who files a certificate of candidacy and does not withdraw shall appear on the primary election ballot unless, by the 10th day after the **INITIAL** filing deadline specified under § 5–303 of this title, the individual's death or disqualification is known to the applicable board with which the certificate of candidacy was filed.

- 7 (a) (1) If the filing deadline was extended under § 5–303.1(b) of 8 This title and there are still no candidates for either of the offices of 9 Governor and Lieutenant Governor for a primary election after the 10 Extended filing deadline passes, the State central committee of the 11 Appropriate political party shall select a candidate to fill each of the 12 Two vacancies.
- 13 **(2)** ON OR BEFORE THE SEVENTH DAY AFTER THE EXTENDED 14 DEADLINE PASSES:
- 15 (I) THE STATE CENTRAL COMMITTEE SHALL FILE A
 16 CERTIFICATE OF DESIGNATION FOR THE CANDIDATE FOR GOVERNOR AND THE
 17 CANDIDATE FOR LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR SELECTED BY THE STATE CENTRAL
 18 COMMITTEE; AND
- 19 (II) THE CANDIDATE FOR GOVERNOR AND THE CANDIDATE FOR 20 LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR SELECTED BY THE STATE CENTRAL COMMITTEE EACH 21 SHALL FILE A CERTIFICATE OF CANDIDACY WITH THE STATE BOARD.
- (B) If either of the candidates of a Governor and Lieutenant Governor unit dies, withdraws the candidacy, or becomes disqualified for any reason prior to the INITIAL deadline for filing a certificate of candidacy for a primary election under § 5–303 of this title, the remaining candidate may:
- 26 (1) designate a successor candidate who shall file a certificate of candidacy 27 before the later of:
- 28 (i) the INITIAL deadline specified under § 5–303 of this title; or
- 29 (ii) the fifth day following the death, withdrawal, or disqualification 30 of the former candidate;
- 31 (2) withdraw under Subtitle 5 of this title; or
- 32 (3) after withdrawing under paragraph (2) of this subsection, form a 33 successor unit for the candidacy for the offices of Governor and Lieutenant Governor by

- filing a certificate of candidacy by the date specified under subsection [(b)] (C) of this section.
- [(b)] (C) The candidates of the successor unit for Governor and Lieutenant Governor formed under subsection [(a)(3)] (B)(3) of this section each shall file a certificate of candidacy as a successor unit before the later of:
- 6 (1) the **INITIAL** deadline for filing a certificate of candidacy for the primary 7 election under § 5–303 of this title; or
- 8 (2) the fifth day following the death, withdrawal, or disqualification of the 9 former candidate.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 11 October 1, 2023.
