1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Cemeteries – Interment – ~~Pet Remains – Duty of Perpetual Care~~**

3 FOR the purpose of making certain provisions of law governing cemeteries applicable to pet
4 cemeteries; providing that a certain registered cemeterian, registered crematory
5 operator, or permit holder who sells or offers to sell to the public certain services for
6 pet remains owes a duty of perpetual care for the cemetery in which certain pet
7 remains are interred; requiring the Director of the Office of Cemetery Oversight to
8 adopt regulations to enforce certain provisions of this Act; and generally relating to
9 ~~perpetual care for cemeteries that inter~~ the interment of pet remains.

15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
 16 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

17 **Article – Business Regulation**

18 5–101.

19 (a) In this title the following words have the meanings indicated.

20 *(l)* “Interment” means all final disposition of human remains **OR PET REMAINS,**
 21 including:

22 *(1)* earth burial;

23 *(2)* mausoleum entombment; and

24 *(3)* niche or columbarium interment.

25 **(O) (1) “PET REMAINS” MEANS THE BODY OF A DECEASED ANIMAL THAT**
 26 **WAS KEPT AS A PET.**

27 **(2) “PET REMAINS” INCLUDES THE BODY OF A PET OR A PART OF A**
 28 **PET’S BODY IN ANY STATE OF DECOMPOSITION OR THE BODY OF A PET AFTER**
 29 **HAVING BEEN CREMATED.**

30 **[(o)] (P) (1) “Preneed goods” means burial goods that are sold before the**
 31 **buyer’s death.**

32 **(2) “Preneed goods” does not include burial space.**

1 [(p)] (Q) “Provide burial goods” means a retail transaction:

2 (1) to erect, service, or inscribe burial memorials; or

3 (2) to sell burial goods.

4 [(q)] (R) “Registered cemeterian” means an individual registered to operate a
5 cemetery as a sole proprietor or on behalf of a sole proprietor or of a permit holder.

6 [(r)] (S) “Registered crematory operator” means an individual registered to
7 operate a crematory as a sole proprietor or on behalf of a sole proprietor or permit holder.

8 [(s)] (T) “Registered seller” means an individual registered to provide burial
9 goods as a sole proprietor or on behalf of a sole proprietor or of a permit holder.

10 [(t)] (U) “Registration” means a registration issued by the Director authorizing
11 an individual to operate a cemetery, to operate a crematory, or to provide burial goods.

12 [(u)] (V) “Responsible party” means a sole proprietor or the individual
13 designated by a partnership, limited liability company, or corporation to be responsible for
14 the operations of a cemetery, crematory, or burial goods business.

16 (a) A preneed burial contract shall contain:

17 (1) the name of the buyer;

18 (2) the name of the seller;

19 (3) the name of each individual, other than the buyer, as to whom the
20 preneed goods or preneed services are to be furnished;

21 (4) THE NAME OF THE PET, IF APPLICABLE;

22 (5) a description of the preneed goods or preneed services; and

23 [(5)] (6) the amount of the buyer’s financial obligation.

25 (d) (1) If a preneed burial contract provides, for 2 or more individuals **OR PETS,**
26 preneed goods or preneed services to which the trust requirements of this subtitle apply, a
27 seller may designate in the seller’s records the consideration paid for each individual **OR**
28 **PET.**

2 (A) IN THIS SECTION, "PERPETUAL CARE" HAS THE MEANING STATED IN §
3 5-601 OF THIS TITLE.

4 (B) A REGISTERED CEMETERIAN, REGISTERED CREMATORY OPERATOR, OR
5 PERMIT HOLDER THAT ENGAGES IN THE OPERATION OF A CEMETERY, CREMATORY,
6 OR BURIAL GOODS BUSINESS WHO SELLS OR OFFERS TO SELL TO THE PUBLIC
7 CREMATION SERVICES, A BURIAL LOT, OR A BURIAL RIGHT IN A CEMETERY FOR PET
8 REMAINS AS TO WHICH PERPETUAL CARE IS STATED OR IMPLIED OWES A DUTY OF
9 PERPETUAL CARE FOR THE CEMETERY IN WHICH THE PET REMAINS ARE INTERRED.

10 (C) THE DIRECTOR SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS IN ACCORDANCE WITH §
11 5-204(A) OF THIS TITLE TO ENFORCE THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SECTION.

12 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
13 October 1, 2023.
