1 (a) There is a Senator George C. Edwards Fund.

2 (b) The purpose of the Fund is to provide grant or loan funding to capital  
3 infrastructure projects and business development projects that improve the economic  
4 conditions in the region.

5 (c) The  ~~Council~~ **EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR** shall administer the Fund.

6 (d) (1) The Fund consists of:

7 (i) appropriations as provided in the State budget;

8 (ii) interest or other income earned on the investment of money in  
9 the Fund; and

10 (iii) any other money accepted for the benefit of the Fund.

11 (2) In each of fiscal years 2024 through 2026, the Governor shall include in  
12 the annual operating or capital budget bill an appropriation of at least \$10,000,000 to the  
13 Fund.

14 (e) Money in the Fund may be used only to:

15 (1) award grants and provide loans to capital infrastructure projects and  
16 business development projects to improve the economic conditions in the region; and

17 (2) pay the costs necessary to administer the Fund, **INCLUDING PAYING**  
18 **THE SALARY OF THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR.**

19 (f) (1) The Fund is a special, nonlapsing fund that is not subject to reversion  
20 under § 7-302 of the State Finance and Procurement Article.

21 (2) The State Treasurer shall hold the Fund separately, and the  
22 Comptroller shall account for the Fund.

23 (3) The State Treasurer shall invest the money in the Fund in the same  
24 manner as other State money may be invested.

25 (4) Any investment earnings of the Fund shall be credited to the Fund.

27 (a) A member county or local entity within a member county may submit a  
28 proposal for funding under this part.

(b) To qualify for funding, a project shall be:

(1) a capital infrastructure project that:

(i) is linked to economic development in the region, as approved by the ~~VETTING~~ Board; and

(ii) receives 20% matching funds from the member county where the project is located, another local entity, a private business, or a combination thereof;

(2) a business development project that:

(i) encourages and promotes downtown neighborhood revitalization, small business tourism, or other areas as approved by the ~~VETTING~~ Board; and

(ii) receives 10% matching funds from the member county where the project is located, another local entity, a private business, or a combination thereof; or

(3) any other project that the ~~VETTING~~ Board determines is appropriate to promote economic development in the region.

(c) (1) (i) The ~~VETTING~~ Board shall develop criteria to review, evaluate, and rate project proposals for funding under this part.

(ii) The criteria in subparagraph (i) of this paragraph shall ensure that the project:

1. creates or retains jobs;
2. creates or retains businesses;
3. increases wages; or
4. creates new State or local tax revenue.

**(2) (I) THE ~~VOTING~~ BOARD SHALL CHOOSE WHICH PROJECTS TO AWARD GRANTS AND LOANS TO BASED ON THE CRITERIA DEVELOPED IN ACCORDANCE WITH PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION.**

**(II) The ~~VETTING~~ Board OR THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR shall distribute grants and loans to projects based on [the criteria developed in accordance with paragraph (1) of this subsection] **THE DECISIONS MADE BY THE ~~VOTING~~ BOARD IN ACCORDANCE WITH SUBPARAGRAPH (I) OF THIS PARAGRAPH.****

1 (d) (1) The ~~VETTING~~ Board OR THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR shall monitor  
2 and track the progress of each project that receives funding under this part.

3 (2) If the ~~VETTING~~ Board determines that sufficient progress is not being  
4 made toward achieving the requirements of this section, the ~~VETTING~~ Board may reclaim  
5 the awarded funds.

6 (e) The funding provided in this section shall be used to supplement and not  
7 supplant any funds that would otherwise be provided to the ~~VETTING~~ Board or the member  
8 counties.

10 (a) On or before December 31 each year, the ~~VETTING~~ Board shall report to the  
11 Governor and, in accordance with § 2-1257 of the State Government Article, the General  
12 Assembly on the implementation of this part.

13 (b) The report required in subsection (a) of this section shall include,  
14 disaggregated by member county:

15 (1) the number of new projects funded during the previous year;

16 (2) the number of projects that were completed during the previous year;

17 (3) the number of ongoing projects that were not completed during the  
18 previous year;

19 (4) the amount and type of funding received by each project;

20 (5) the current status of each ongoing project; and

21 (6) any other relevant economic metrics determined by the ~~VETTING~~  
22 Board.
