2 **Prince George's County – Alcoholic Beverages – Class B Beer, Wine, and Liquor**  
3 **Licenses, ~~Entertainment Permits, Inspections, and Penalties, and Workgroup~~**

4 **PG 302-23**

5 FOR the purpose of authorizing the holder of a Class B beer, wine, and liquor license in  
6 Prince George's County to serve beer, wine, and liquor by the glass or by the bottle  
7 for on-premises consumption; ~~authorizing the holder of a certain entertainment~~  
8 ~~permit to contract with one or more promoters to publicize, sell tickets for, organize,~~  
9 ~~operate, produce, or stage an event, which may include patron dancing and~~  
10 ~~entertainment; applying certain provisions relating to a certain entertainment~~  
11 ~~permit to contracted promoters;~~ authorizing certain inspections of certain licensed  
12 premises by or on behalf of the Board of License Commissioners for Prince George's  
13 County; ~~limiting the number of certain inspections;~~ requiring a certain inspector to  
14 provide a report of an inspection to the license holder and the Board within a certain  
15 time period; requiring the Board each year to publish a list containing the number  
16 of inspections conducted of each licensed premises in the previous calendar year;  
17 requiring the Board to establish a certain fine structure and to publish and maintain  
18 ~~a list of penalties~~ certain penalties and fines information for certain violations of  
19 alcoholic beverages laws; establishing the Workgroup to Study Best Practices for  
20 Safe Event Promotion in Prince George's County; and generally relating to alcoholic  
21 beverages in Prince George's County and the Workgroup to Study Best Practices for  
22 Safe Event Promotion in Prince George's County.

15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,  
16 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

17 **Article – Alcoholic Beverages**

18 26–102.

19 This title applies only in Prince George’s County.

20 26–902.

21 (a) There is a Class B beer, wine, and liquor license.

22 (c) (1) The license authorizes the license holder, at a hotel or restaurant at  
23 retail at the place described in the license, to sell beer, wine, and liquor:

24 (i) **BY THE GLASS OR BY THE BOTTLE** for on–premises  
25 consumption; and

26 (ii) subject to paragraph (2) of this subsection, for off–premises  
27 consumption only:

28 1. from the main bar; and

29 2. in the main portion of the dining room facilities.

30 (2) The off–sale privilege set out in paragraph (1)(ii) of this subsection is  
31 limited to those license holders who had the privilege on July 1, 1970.

26 ~~holder may exercise the privileges of the permit.~~

28           ~~(e) Before being issued the permit, an applicant shall:~~

29                   ~~(1) submit evidence to the satisfaction of the Board that:~~

2                   ~~(ii) there are no unpaid taxes due from the applicant to the State,~~

25 ~~the applicant, and opponents of the applicant an opportunity to be heard.~~

~~(2) If the Board immediately suspends a permit, the Board shall:~~

~~(i) give the permit holder notice of the suspension and a hearing on the suspension at which the permit holder may be heard and present evidence; and~~

~~(ii) hold the hearing within 30 days after the suspension is imposed.~~

~~(k) (1) At the hearing, the Board shall determine:~~

~~(i) whether the permit holder violated this section or other law; and~~

~~(ii) if a violation occurred, what penalty to impose among those listed in paragraphs (2) and (3) of this subsection.~~

~~(2) Subject to paragraph (3) of this subsection, if the Board finds that a person has violated this section or any other law, the Board:~~

~~(i) may revoke or continue the suspension of the permit; and~~

~~(ii) shall impose on the person a penalty of:~~

~~1. for a first offense, at least \$1,000 but not more than \$12,500; and~~

~~2. for each subsequent offense, at least \$5,000.~~

~~(3) The Board:~~

~~(i) shall revoke the permit of a person who the Board determines violated this section or any other law twice in 24 months; and~~

~~(ii) may not consider an application from the person for a new permit or an application for a new permit for the premises that was the subject of the revocation until at least 12 months after the order of revocation is issued.~~

~~(4) If the Board determines that the permit holder did not violate this section, the Board shall immediately reinstate the permit.~~

~~(l) (1) The circuit court may issue a temporary restraining order to immediately close to the public the entire operation of the premises if the county establishes that:~~

~~(i) the security plan described under subsection (c)(2) of this section has not been implemented; and~~

1           (ii) ~~the public health, safety, or welfare requires emergency action.~~

2           (2) ~~On issuance of a temporary restraining order under paragraph (1) of~~  
3 ~~this subsection, the county shall give the permit holder written notice of and reasons for~~  
4 ~~the closure.~~

5           (3) ~~The permit holder promptly shall be given an opportunity for a hearing~~  
6 ~~in circuit court on the granting of the temporary restraining order in accordance with Title~~  
7 ~~15, Chapter 500 of the Maryland Rules.~~

8           (m) ~~The Board shall adopt regulations to carry out this section.~~

9           (n) ~~The annual fee for the permit is \$1,500, which is in addition to the annual fee~~  
10 ~~for the Class B license.~~

12           (A) (1) **THIS SECTION APPLIES ONLY TO INSPECTIONS PERFORMED BY OR**  
13 **ON BEHALF OF THE BOARD.**

14           (2) **UNLESS THE INSPECTION IS PERFORMED ON BEHALF OF THE**  
15 **BOARD AND DOES NOT RELATE TO HEALTH AND SAFETY, THIS SECTION DOES NOT**  
16 **APPLY TO INSPECTIONS CONDUCTED BY ONE OR MORE OF THE FOLLOWING**  
17 **PERSONS:**

18                   (I) **A POLICE DEPARTMENT;**

19                   (II) **A FIRE DEPARTMENT OR FIRE INSPECTOR; OR**

20                   (III) **A HEALTH DEPARTMENT.**

21           (B) **AN INSPECTION OF A LICENSED PREMISES MAY BE CONDUCTED WITH**  
22 **OR WITHOUT PRIOR NOTICE IN ORDER TO:**

23                   (1) **PROVIDE ASSISTANCE TO THE BOARD IN ANY MATTER**  
24 **PERTAINING TO ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES;**

25                   (2) **CONDUCT BACKGROUND INVESTIGATIONS AND CRIMINAL**  
26 **HISTORY RECORDS CHECKS ON ALL LICENSE APPLICANTS;**

27                   (3) **MAKE ROUTINE INSPECTIONS OF LICENSED ESTABLISHMENTS IN**  
28 **THE COUNTY TO ENSURE THAT THEY ARE IN COMPLIANCE WITH ALL APPROPRIATE**  
29 **STATE LAWS, LOCAL LAWS, RESTRICTIONS, AND BOARD RULES AND REGULATIONS;**

1 (4) COORDINATE INFORMATION WITH OTHER APPROPRIATE  
2 REGULATORY AGENCIES;

3 (5) TAKE APPROPRIATE ACTION ON ANY WRITTEN REPORT OF  
4 VIOLATIONS FORWARDED BY A UNIFORMED OFFICER OF A MUNICIPAL OR COUNTY  
5 POLICE DEPARTMENT, THE MARYLAND-NATIONAL CAPITAL PARK POLICE, OR THE  
6 STATE POLICE;

7 (6) INVESTIGATE COMPLAINTS MADE AGAINST A LICENSED  
8 ESTABLISHMENT; OR

9 (7) INITIATE COVERT INSPECTIONS AND INVESTIGATIONS OF  
10 LICENSED ESTABLISHMENTS THAT MAY BE NECESSARY TO ENSURE COMPLIANCE OR  
11 TO PROVE OR DISPROVE ALLEGED VIOLATIONS.

25 (A) THE BOARD SHALL ESTABLISH A STANDARD FINE STRUCTURE FOR  
26 VIOLATIONS OF THIS TITLE THAT GIVES THE BOARD FLEXIBILITY TO CONSIDER  
27 AGGRAVATING OR MITIGATING FACTORS WHEN DETERMINING THE AMOUNT OF A  
28 FINE IMPOSED UNDER THIS TITLE.

29 (B) THE BOARD SHALL PUBLISH MONTHLY AND MAINTAIN ON ITS WEBSITE;

30 (1) A LIST OF PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS OF THIS TITLE; AND

31 (2) THE STANDARD FINE STRUCTURE ESTABLISHED UNDER  
32 SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION, INCLUDING A LIST OF AGGRAVATING AND

3 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That:

4 (a) There is a Workgroup to Study Best Practices for Safe Event Promotion in  
5 Prince George's County.

6 (b) The Workgroup consists of the following members:

7 (1) the Chair of the Prince George's County Senate Delegation, or the  
8 Chair's designee;

9 (2) the Chair of the Prince George's County House Delegation, or the  
10 Chair's designee;

11 (3) the Chair of the Prince George's County Council, or the Chair's  
12 designee;

13 (4) the State's Attorney for Prince George's County, or the State's  
14 Attorney's designee;

15 (5) the Chair of the Board of License Commissioners for Prince George's  
16 County, or the Chair's designee;

17 (6) the following members, appointed by the County Executive of Prince  
18 George's County:

19 (i) one representative of the Prince George's County Police  
20 Department;

21 (ii) one representative of the Prince George's County Fire  
22 Department; and

23 (iii) one representative of the Prince George's County Permitting,  
24 Inspections and Enforcement Department; and

25 (7) the following members, appointed by the Chair of the Prince George's  
26 County House Delegation:

27 (i) one individual who is knowledgeable of the event promotion  
28 industry in Prince George's County;

29 (ii) one individual who is a current holder of an entertainment  
30 permit under § 26-1103 of the Alcoholic Beverages Article; and

1 (iii) one individual who is a former holder of an entertainment permit  
2 under § 26–1103 of the Alcoholic Beverages Article.

3 (c) The Chair of the Prince George’s County House Delegation shall designate the  
4 chair of the Workgroup.

5 (d) The Prince George’s County House Delegation shall provide staff for the  
6 Workgroup.

7 (e) A member of the Workgroup or any subgroup established under subsection (g)  
8 of this section:

9 (1) may not receive compensation as a member of the Workgroup or  
10 subgroup; but

11 (2) is entitled to reimbursement for expenses under the Standard State  
12 Travel Regulations, as provided in the State budget.

13 (f) The Workgroup shall:

14 (1) identify any current barriers to safe event promotion in Prince George’s  
15 County;

16 (2) identify available options for safe event promotion activities and  
17 promotion restrictions;

18 (3) review current and previous practices of event promotion; and

19 (4) make recommendations on best practices for safe event promotion and  
20 the feasibility of permitting event promoters in Prince George’s County.

21 (g) (1) The Workgroup may establish a subgroup within the Workgroup to  
22 assist the Workgroup in carrying out its duties, including by conducting research and  
23 producing reports.

24 (2) A subgroup established under paragraph (1) of this subsection may  
25 include an individual who is not a member of the Workgroup, including a representative of  
26 an insurance carrier or any other relevant expert.

27 (h) On or before December 1, 2024, the Workgroup shall report its findings and  
28 recommendations to the Chair of the Prince George’s County Council and the County  
29 Executive of Prince George’s County and, in accordance with § 2–1257 of the State  
30 Government Article, the Chair of the Prince George’s County Senate Delegation and the  
31 Chair of the Prince George’s County House Delegation.

32 SECTION ~~2~~ 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect  
33 July 1, 2023. Section 2 of this Act shall remain effective for a period of 2 years and, at the

1 end of June 30, 2025, Section 2 of this Act, with no further action required by the General  
2 Assembly, shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
