CHAPTER _____

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Waterway Incident Notification System (WINS) Workgroup**

3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Waterway Incident Notification System (WINS)
4 Workgroup to study issues and factors regarding the feasibility of establishing a
5 Waterway Incident Notification System to notify members of the public of certain
6 waterway emergencies; and generally relating to the Waterway Incident Notification
7 System (WINS) Workgroup.

8 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
9 That:

10 (a) There is a Waterway Incident Notification System (WINS) Workgroup.

11 (b) The Workgroup consists of the following members:

12 (1) one member of the Senate of Maryland, appointed by the President of
13 the Senate;

14 (2) one member of the House of Delegates, appointed by the Speaker of the
15 House;

16 (3) the Secretary of Emergency Management, or the Secretary's designee;

17 (4) the Chair of the Maryland 9-1-1 Board, or the Chair's designee;

2 Superintendent's designee;

3 (6) the Secretary of Information Technology, or the Secretary's designee;

7 (i) one representative from the Dorchester County Emergency
8 Management Division, appointed by the Director of the Dorchester County Department of
9 Emergency Services;

10 (ii) one representative from the Anne Arundel County Office of
11 Emergency Management, appointed by the Director of the Anne Arundel County Office of
12 Emergency Management; and

13 (iii) one representative from the St. Mary's County Emergency
14 Management Division, appointed by the Director of the St. Mary's County Department of
15 Emergency Services.

16 (c) The Secretary of Emergency Management, or the Secretary's designee, may
17 appoint additional members to the Workgroup.

18 ~~(d)~~ (d) The Secretary of Emergency Management, or the Secretary's designee, shall
19 designate the chair of the Workgroup.

20 ~~(e)~~ (e) The Maryland Department of Emergency Management shall provide staff for
21 the Workgroup.

22 ~~(f)~~ (f) A member of the Workgroup:

23 (1) may not receive compensation as a member of the Workgroup; but

24 (2) is entitled to reimbursement for expenses under the Standard State
25 Travel Regulations, as provided in the State budget.

26 ~~(g)~~ (g) The Workgroup shall study and make recommendations regarding:

27 (1) the feasibility of establishing a Waterway Incident Notification System
28 to notify members of the public, including recreational boaters and commercial watermen,
29 of active waterway emergencies involving a person at risk of death or serious bodily harm,
30 emergency marine events, or marine hazards; and

1 (2) potential partnerships between the State, the U.S. Coast Guard, the
2 U.S. Navy, and nearby states to improve notifications to members of the public, including
3 recreational boaters and commercial watermen, of waterway emergencies involving a
4 person at risk of death or serious bodily harm, emergency marine events, or marine
5 hazards.

6 (h) (1) On or before December 31, 2023, the Workgroup shall submit an
7 interim report of its findings and recommendations to the Governor and, in accordance with
8 § 2-1257 of the State Government Article, the General Assembly.

9 ~~(g)~~ (2) On or before ~~December 31, 2023~~ September 30, 2024, the Workgroup
10 shall submit a final report of its findings and recommendations to the Governor and, in
11 accordance with § 2-1257 of the State Government Article, the General Assembly.

12 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June
13 1, 2023. It shall remain effective for a period of ~~1 year~~ 2 years and 1 month and, at the end
14 of June 30, ~~2024~~ 2025, this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly,
15 shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
