The Town of Middletown receives over 1/3 of its raw drinking water from natural springs in the mountains 5 miles outside of the Town limits. The waterline that conveys this raw water was installed in 1893 and still in use today. The section of waterline from the Town's reservoir to I-70 (about a 1 1/2 mile length) has had many waterline breaks in the past 3-5 years and this section of the waterline needs to be replaced.
