Education, Energy, and the Environment

Garrett County - Board of County Commissioners - Meetings

This bill requires the Garrett County Commissioners to hold public meetings in person or through live video streaming at least twice a month. The bill also prohibits the Garrett County Commissioners from meeting solely through live video streaming for more than two consecutive meetings in the absence of a formal declaration of a state of emergency.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: None.

Local Effect: Altering the meeting times of the Garrett County Commissioners will not affect county finances.

Small Business Effect: None.

Analysis

Current Law: The Garrett County Commissioners are required to hold public meetings weekly. Additionally, the commissioners must provide notice of the dates and times of all public meetings, including any schedule changes or cancellations. The commissioners must also schedule or announce administrative sessions to review matters as specified. Each commissioner is required to attend scheduled or planned meetings of an appointed commission, board, or committee.

Garrett County has three county commissioners; each elected to serve a four-year term.

Prior Introductions: Similar legislation has not been introduced within the last three years.
