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## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **State Government – Maryland Reparations Commission – Establishment**  
3 **(Maryland Repair Act)**

4 FOR the purpose of establishing the Maryland Reparations Commission to develop and  
5 administer a program for the provision of compensatory benefits to the descendants  
6 of individuals enslaved in the State; providing that any individual whose ancestors  
7 were enslaved in the State is eligible to receive benefits administered by the  
8 Commission; requiring State agencies to assist the Commission in a certain manner;  
9 requiring the Commission to pay certain cash sums to certain applicants and to  
10 reimburse certain applicants for certain tuition payments; and generally relating to  
11 the Maryland Reparations Commission.

12 BY adding to

13 Article – State Government  
14 Section 9–3801 through 9–3808 to be under the new subtitle “Subtitle 38. Maryland  
15 Reparations Commission”  
16 Annotated Code of Maryland  
17 (2021 Replacement Volume and 2023 Supplement)

18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,  
19 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

20 **Article – State Government**

21 **SUBTITLE 38. MARYLAND REPARATIONS COMMISSION.**

22 **9–3801.**

23 **IN THIS SUBTITLE, “COMMISSION” MEANS THE MARYLAND REPARATIONS**  
24 **COMMISSION.**

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EXPLANATION: CAPITALS INDICATE MATTER ADDED TO EXISTING LAW.  
[Brackets] indicate matter deleted from existing law.

2 **THERE IS A MARYLAND REPARATIONS COMMISSION.**

3 **9-3803.**

4 **(A) (1) THE COMMISSION CONSISTS OF:**

5 **(I) THE STATE ARCHIVIST, OR A PERSON WITH EXPERTISE IN**  
6 **FAMILY HISTORY WHO IS DESIGNATED BY THE STATE ARCHIVIST;**

7 **(II) ONE MEMBER OF THE MARYLAND HISTORICAL SOCIETY,**  
8 **DESIGNATED BY THE PRESIDENT OF THE MARYLAND HISTORICAL SOCIETY;**

9 **(III) ONE MEMBER OF THE NATIONAL ASSOCIATION FOR THE**  
10 **ADVANCEMENT OF COLORED PEOPLE, DESIGNATED BY THE NATIONAL**  
11 **ASSOCIATION FOR THE ADVANCEMENT OF COLORED PEOPLE MARYLAND STATE**  
12 **CONFERENCE PRESIDENT;**

13 **(IV) ONE MEMBER OF THE GREATER BALTIMORE URBAN**  
14 **LEAGUE, DESIGNATED BY THE PRESIDENT OF THE GREATER BALTIMORE URBAN**  
15 **LEAGUE;**

16 **(V) ONE VOLUNTEER EMPLOYEE OF THE HARRIET TUBMAN**  
17 **MUSEUM AND EDUCATION CENTER, DESIGNATED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF**  
18 **CAMBRIDGE;**

19 **(VI) ONE MEMBER OF THE REGINALD F. LEWIS MUSEUM OF**  
20 **MARYLAND AFRICAN AMERICAN HISTORY AND CULTURE, DESIGNATED BY THE**  
21 **BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE MUSEUM;**

22 **(VII) FIVE MEMBERS APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR, AT LEAST**  
23 **ONE OF WHICH SHALL BE A RESEARCHER WITH EXPERTISE ON REPARATIONS AND**  
24 **RACE RELATIONS;**

25 **(VIII) SUBJECT TO PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION, THE**  
26 **FOLLOWING MEMBERS, SELECTED BY THE MARYLAND LEGISLATIVE BLACK**  
27 **CAUCUS:**

28 **1. TWO MARYLAND RESIDENTS WHO ARE BUSINESS**  
29 **OWNERS; AND**

1                   **2. THREE REPRESENTATIVES OF COMMUNITIES WITH**  
2 **HIGH MINORITY POPULATIONS; AND**

3                   **(IX) TWO EMPLOYEES OF HISTORICALLY BLACK COLLEGES IN**  
4 **THE STATE WHO HAVE EXPERTISE IN THE HISTORY OF SLAVERY, SELECTED BY THE**  
5 **MARYLAND LEGISLATIVE BLACK CAUCUS.**

6                   **(2) AT LEAST ONE MEMBER SELECTED UNDER PARAGRAPH (1)(VIII)**  
7 **OF THIS SUBSECTION SHALL BE A RESEARCHER WITH EXPERTISE ON REPARATIONS**  
8 **AND RACE RELATIONS.**

9                   **(B) THE COMMISSION SHALL SELECT FROM AMONG ITS MEMBERS A CHAIR**  
10 **AND A VICE CHAIR.**

11                   **(C) (1) THE TERM OF A MEMBER APPOINTED OR SELECTED UNDER**  
12 **SUBSECTION (A)(1)(VII), (VIII), OR (IX) OF THIS SECTION IS 2 YEARS.**

13                   **(2) THE TERMS OF MEMBERS APPOINTED OR SELECTED UNDER**  
14 **SUBSECTION (A)(1)(VII), (VIII), OR (IX) OF THIS SECTION ARE STAGGERED AS**  
15 **REQUIRED BY THE TERMS PROVIDED FOR MEMBERS OF THE COMMISSION ON**  
16 **OCTOBER 1, 2024.**

17                   **(D) A MEMBER OF THE COMMISSION:**

18                   **(1) MAY NOT RECEIVE COMPENSATION AS A MEMBER OF THE**  
19 **COMMISSION; BUT**

20                   **(2) IS ENTITLED TO REIMBURSEMENT FOR EXPENSES UNDER THE**  
21 **STANDARD STATE TRAVEL REGULATIONS, AS PROVIDED IN THE STATE BUDGET.**

22                   **(E) THE STATE ARCHIVES SHALL PROVIDE STAFF FOR THE COMMISSION.**

23 **9-3804.**

24                   **(A) THE PURPOSE OF THE COMMISSION IS TO DEVELOP AND ADMINISTER A**  
25 **PROGRAM FOR THE PROVISION OF COMPENSATORY BENEFITS TO DESCENDANTS OF**  
26 **INDIVIDUALS ENSLAVED IN THE STATE.**

27                   **(B) ANY INDIVIDUAL WHOSE ANCESTORS WERE ENSLAVED IN THE STATE**  
28 **SHALL BE ELIGIBLE TO RECEIVE BENEFITS ADMINISTERED BY THE COMMISSION.**

29 **9-3805.**

1 (A) (1) THE COMMISSION SHALL DEVELOP:

2 (I) AN APPLICATION FORM TO BE USED BY INDIVIDUALS  
3 APPLYING FOR BENEFITS THAT ALLOWS THE APPLICANT TO INCLUDE EVIDENCE  
4 THAT THE APPLICANT IS DESCENDED FROM INDIVIDUALS ENSLAVED IN THE STATE;  
5 AND

6 (II) A PROCESS FOR APPROVING APPLICATIONS FOR BENEFITS.

7 (2) THE FORM REQUIRED UNDER PARAGRAPH (1)(I) OF THIS  
8 SUBSECTION SHALL INCLUDE A NOTICE THAT ANY INFORMATION SUBMITTED WITH  
9 THE FORM MAY BE SHARED WITH STATE AGENCIES IN ACCORDANCE WITH  
10 PROCEDURES ADOPTED UNDER SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION.

11 (B) (1) THE COMMISSION SHALL ADOPT COMMON PROCEDURES FOR  
12 EVALUATING EVIDENCE SUBMITTED IN CONJUNCTION WITH APPLICATIONS FOR  
13 BENEFITS UNDER THE PROGRAM AND DETERMINING WHETHER APPLICANTS ARE  
14 DESCENDED FROM INDIVIDUALS ENSLAVED IN THE STATE.

15 (2) THE COMMISSION MAY SEEK THE ASSISTANCE OF STATE  
16 AGENCIES IN:

17 (I) DEVELOPING THE PROCEDURES REQUIRED UNDER  
18 PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION; AND

19 (II) EVALUATING EVIDENCE SUBMITTED IN CONJUNCTION WITH  
20 AN APPLICATION FOR BENEFITS.

21 (3) TO THE EXTENT AUTHORIZED BY LAW, STATE AGENCIES SHALL  
22 ASSIST THE COMMISSION IN EVALUATING EVIDENCE WHEN THE COMMISSION  
23 REQUESTS ASSISTANCE.

24 9-3806.

25 (A) (1) ANY APPLICANT DETERMINED BY THE COMMISSION TO BE  
26 DESCENDED FROM INDIVIDUALS ENSLAVED IN THE STATE SHALL BE PAID A CASH  
27 SUM DETERMINED BY THE COMMISSION.

28 (2) IN CALCULATING THE CASH PAYMENT REQUIRED TO BE PAID  
29 UNDER THIS SUBSECTION, THE COMMISSION SHALL CONSIDER THE LENGTH AND  
30 CONDITIONS OF THE ENSLAVEMENT OF THE INDIVIDUAL OR INDIVIDUALS FROM  
31 WHOM THE APPLICANT IS DESCENDED.

1           **(B) THE COMMISSION SHALL REIMBURSE ANY APPLICANT DETERMINED TO**  
2 **BE DESCENDED FROM INDIVIDUALS ENSLAVED IN THE STATE FOR ANY TUITION**  
3 **PAYMENT THE APPLICANT MAKES TO ANY INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION IN**  
4 **THE STATE.**

5           **(C) THE COMMISSION SHALL COOPERATE WITH BANKING INSTITUTIONS**  
6 **AND STATE AGENCIES TO ASSIST ANY APPLICANT DETERMINED TO BE DESCENDED**  
7 **FROM INDIVIDUALS ENSLAVED IN THE STATE IN APPLYING FOR AND RECEIVING**  
8 **LOANS WITH LOW COLLATERAL AND INTEREST RATES TO THE EXTENT AUTHORIZED**  
9 **BY LAW.**

10           **(D) THE COMMISSION SHALL COOPERATE WITH BANKING INSTITUTIONS TO**  
11 **ASSIST ANY APPLICANT DETERMINED TO BE DESCENDED FROM INDIVIDUALS**  
12 **ENSLAVED IN THE STATE IN APPLYING FOR AND RECEIVING MORTGAGES WITH LOW**  
13 **INTEREST RATES TO THE EXTENT AUTHORIZED BY LAW.**

14 **9-3807.**

15           **FOR EACH FISCAL YEAR, THE GOVERNOR SHALL INCLUDE IN THE ANNUAL**  
16 **BUDGET BILL AN APPROPRIATION IN AN AMOUNT SUFFICIENT TO CARRY OUT THE**  
17 **REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SUBTITLE, INCLUDING ANY MONEY REQUIRED TO BE PAID**  
18 **TO APPLICANTS THE COMMISSION DETERMINES TO BE DESCENDED FROM**  
19 **INDIVIDUALS ENSLAVED IN THE STATE.**

20 **9-3808.**

21           **THE COMMISSION SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS TO CARRY OUT THIS**  
22 **SUBTITLE.**

23           **SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED,** That the terms of the initial  
24 members of the Maryland Reparations Commission shall expire as follows:

25           (1) six members in 2025; and

26           (2) six members in 2026.

27           **SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED,** That it is the intent of the General  
28 Assembly that private businesses and organizations in the State that have benefited from  
29 the institution of slavery work proactively with the Maryland Reparations Commission to  
30 provide funds and avenues for compensation for people determined to be descended from  
31 individuals enslaved in the State.

32           **SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED,** That this Act shall take effect  
33 October 1, 2024.
