1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Baltimore City – Alcoholic Beverages – 40th Alcoholic Beverages District –**
3 **Revisions**

4 FOR the purpose of establishing a Class M–F (Municipal Family Fun Center) alcoholic
5 beverages license in the 40th alcoholic beverages district in Baltimore City;
6 authorizing the Board of License Commissioners for Baltimore City to issue a certain
7 Class B beer, wine, and liquor license to a restaurant in a certain location;
8 authorizing a certain Class A license issued for a certain location to remain
9 unexpired until a certain date for the purpose of renewal; and generally relating to
10 alcoholic beverages in Baltimore City.

12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
13 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

14 **Article – Alcoholic Beverages and Cannabis**

15 12–102.

16 This title applies only in Baltimore City.

18 **(A) THERE IS A CLASS M–F (MUNICIPAL FAMILY FUN CENTER) LICENSE**
19 **FOR USE AT A MUNICIPAL BOWLING ALLEY AND SKATING RINK LOCATED ON THE ODD**
20 **SIDE OF THE 1600 BLOCK OF PENNSYLVANIA AVENUE.**

21 **(B) THE BOARD MAY ISSUE THE LICENSE TO AN INDIVIDUAL WHO:**

22 **(1) IS AUTHORIZED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF**
23 **BALTIMORE CITY THROUGH A MANAGEMENT AGREEMENT TO SELL FOOD, BEER,**
24 **WINE, AND LIQUOR FOR ON–PREMISES CONSUMPTION; AND**

25 **(2) HAS EXECUTED A MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING WITH THE**
26 **UPTON WEST COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION.**

27 **(C) THE LICENSE AUTHORIZES THE HOLDER TO SELL BEER, WINE, AND**
28 **LIQUOR FOR ON–PREMISES CONSUMPTION.**

29 **(D) THE HOURS OF SALE FOR ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES ARE:**

30 **(1) FROM 11:30 A.M. TO 11 P.M. MONDAY THROUGH THURSDAY;**

1 **(2) FROM 11:30 A.M. TO MIDNIGHT ON FRIDAY;**

2 **(3) FROM 9 A.M. TO MIDNIGHT ON SATURDAY; AND**

3 **(4) FROM 9 A.M. TO 11 P.M. ON SUNDAY.**

4 **(E) THE BOARD SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS TO CARRY OUT THIS SECTION,**
5 **INCLUDING REGULATIONS CONCERNING THE HOLDING OF EVENTS THAT ARE**
6 **CLOSED TO THE PUBLIC.**

7 **(F) THE LICENSE HOLDER MAY NOT:**

8 **(1) PARTICIPATE IN OR PUBLICIZE, IN OR OUTSIDE OF THE LICENSED**
9 **PREMISES, A PUB CRAWL AUTHORIZED UNDER § 12-1101.1 OF THIS TITLE; OR**

10 **(2) EXCEPT FOR AN EVENT THAT IS CLOSED TO THE PUBLIC, ALLOW**
11 **AN OPEN BAR TO BE OPERATED.**

12 **(G) THE ANNUAL LICENSE FEE IS \$500.**

14 (b) Except as provided in subsection (c) of this section, the Board may not issue a
15 new license in:

16 (1) the 40th alcoholic beverages district;

17 (2) the 41st alcoholic beverages district;

18 (3) the 43rd alcoholic beverages district;

19 (4) the 44th alcoholic beverages district; and

20 (5) the 45th alcoholic beverages district.

21 (c) The Board may issue:

22 (1) in the alcoholic beverages districts specified in subsection (b) of this
23 section:

24 (i) a 1-day license; or

25 (ii) a Class B beer, wine, and liquor license to a restaurant that:

26 1. has a minimum capital investment, not including the cost
27 of land and buildings, of \$200,000 for restaurant facilities; and
