2 **Waterway Incident Notification System (WINS) ~~Workgroup~~ – Study**

3 FOR the purpose of ~~establishing the Waterway Incident Notification System (WINS)~~
4 ~~Workgroup~~ requiring the Maryland Department of Emergency Management to study
5 issues and factors regarding the feasibility of establishing a Waterway Incident
6 Notification System (WINS) to notify members of the public of certain waterway
7 emergencies; and generally relating to a study on the Waterway Incident Notification
8 System (WINS) ~~Workgroup~~.

9 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
10 That:

11 (a) ~~There is a Waterway Incident Notification System (WINS) Workgroup.~~

12 (b) ~~The Workgroup consists of the following members:~~

5 (a) In this section, "Department" means the Maryland Department of Emergency
6 Management.

7 ~~(i) (b)~~ The ~~Workgroup~~ Department, in consultation with other interested
8 stakeholders, shall study and make recommendations regarding:

9 (1) the feasibility of establishing a Waterway Incident Notification System
10 (WINS) to notify members of the public, including recreational boaters and commercial
11 watermen, of active waterway emergencies involving a person at risk of death or serious
12 bodily harm, emergency marine events, or marine hazards; and

13 (2) potential partnerships among the State, the U.S. Coast Guard, the U.S.
14 Navy, and nearby states to improve notifications to members of the public, including
15 recreational boaters and commercial watermen, of waterway emergencies involving a
16 person at risk of death or serious bodily harm, emergency marine events, or marine
17 hazards.

18 ~~(h) (i) (c)~~ (1) On or before December ~~31~~ 1, 2024, the ~~Workgroup~~ Department
19 shall submit an interim report of its findings and recommendations to the Governor and,
20 in accordance with § 2-1257 of the State Government Article, the General Assembly.

21 (2) On or before ~~September 30~~ December 1, 2025, the ~~Workgroup~~
22 Department shall submit a final report of its findings and recommendations to the Governor
23 and, in accordance with § 2-1257 of the State Government Article, the General Assembly.

24 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June
25 1, 2024. It shall remain effective for a period of 2 years and 1 month and, at the end of June
26 30, 2026, this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be
27 abrogated and of no further force and effect.
