State Personnel - Line-of-Duty Death and Funeral Benefits

- 3 FOR the purpose of increasing the maximum amount of funeral expenses that may be provided for a line-of-duty death of certain public safety officers and indexing the 4 5 benefit to inflation; repealing an offset against certain funeral expenses for the 6 line-of-duty death of certain public safety officers; increasing the maximum amount 7 of line-of-duty death benefits for State employees and indexing the benefit to inflation; providing a funeral expense benefit for a line-of-duty death for State 8 9 employees and indexing the benefit to inflation; providing for the retroactive 10 application of this Act for certain deaths occurring before the effective date of this 11 Act; and generally relating to line-of-duty death and funeral benefits for State 12 employees.



BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 7 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 8 Article - Public Safety 9 1-202.10 (d) Except as provided in subsection (j) of this section, reasonable funeral (1) 11 expenses, not exceeding [\$10,000] **\$25,000**, shall be paid to the surviving spouse, child, 12 parent, or estate of each of the following individuals who is killed or dies in the performance 13 of duties: 14 (i) a law enforcement officer; 15 (ii) a correctional officer; 16 (iii) a volunteer or career firefighter or rescue squad member; 17 a public safety aviation employee; (iv) a sworn member of the office of State Fire Marshal: or 18 (v) 19 (vi) a hazardous material response team employee. 20 The funeral benefit under this subsection shall be reduced by the 21amount of any related workers' compensation benefits paid under § 9–689 of the Labor and 22Employment Article FOR FISCAL YEAR 2026 AND EACH FISCAL YEAR THEREAFTER, 23 THE FUNERAL BENEFIT PROVIDED IN THE PRIOR FISCAL YEAR SHALL BE ADJUSTED BY ANY CHANGE IN THE CALENDAR YEAR PRECEDING THE FISCAL YEAR IN THE 24CONSUMER PRICE INDEX (ALL URBAN CONSUMERS - UNITED STATES CITY 25AVERAGE - ALL ITEMS), AS PUBLISHED BY THE UNITED STATES BUREAU OF LABOR 26 27 STATISTICS. 28 **Article - State Personnel and Pensions** 29 10-401.
- 30 (a) Except as provided in subsection (b) of this section and § 10–404 of this subtitle, this subtitle applies to all employees of all units in the Executive Branch of State 32 government.



- surviving spouse, children, or dependent parents of any State employee covered by the provisions of § 1–202 of the Public Safety Article who is killed in the performance of duties on or after July 1, 2000.
- 4 (ii) A death benefit may not be paid under this paragraph if an 5 employee is killed as a result of the employee's negligence.
- 6 (iii) An individual who receives a death benefit under this paragraph 7 may not also receive a death benefit under paragraph (1) of this subsection.
- 8 (3) A death benefit under this section shall be in addition to any:
- 9 (i) workers' compensation benefits;
- 10 (ii) proceeds of any form of life insurance, regardless of who paid the 11 premiums on the insurance;
- 12 (iii) benefit provided to a State employee covered by the provisions of 13 § 1–202 of the Public Safety Article; and
- 14 (iv) except as provided in paragraph (1)(iii) of this subsection, 15 benefits paid to a member of the Maryland National Guard, the member's estate, or the 16 member's beneficiaries or survivors by the United States.
- 17 **(4)** FOR FISCAL YEAR 2026 AND EACH FISCAL YEAR THEREAFTER, THE DEATH BENEFITS PROVIDED UNDER THIS SUBSECTION IN THE PRIOR FISCAL 18 19 YEAR SHALL BE ADJUSTED BY ANY CHANGE IN THE CALENDAR YEAR PRECEDING 20 THE FISCAL YEAR IN THE CONSUMER PRICE INDEX (ALL URBAN CONSUMERS - UNITED STATES CITY AVERAGE - ALL ITEMS), AS PUBLISHED BY THE 21UNITED STATES BUREAU OF LABOR STATISTICS. 22
- (D) (1) REASONABLE FUNERAL EXPENSES, NOT EXCEEDING \$25,000, SHALL BE PAID TO THE SURVIVING SPOUSE, CHILD, OR PARENT OR THE ESTATE OF ANY EMPLOYEE SUBJECT TO THIS SECTION WHO IS KILLED OR DIES IN THE PERFORMANCE OF DUTIES.
- (2) FOR FISCAL YEAR 2026 AND EACH FISCAL YEAR THEREAFTER,
 THE FUNERAL BENEFIT PROVIDED IN THE PRIOR FISCAL YEAR SHALL BE ADJUSTED
 BY ANY CHANGE IN THE CALENDAR YEAR PRECEDING THE FISCAL YEAR IN THE
 CONSUMER PRICE INDEX (ALL URBAN CONSUMERS UNITED STATES CITY
 AVERAGE ALL ITEMS), AS PUBLISHED BY THE UNITED STATES BUREAU OF LABOR
 STATISTICS.
- [(d)] (E) (1) On notification by the head of the unit that employed the decedent, the Secretary shall determine whether a death benefit will be paid under this

- 2 (2) If the Secretary determines that a death benefit is payable, payment 3 shall be made:
- 4 (i) to the surviving spouse;
- 5 (ii) if there is no surviving spouse, to the surviving children, in equal 6 shares; or
- 7 (iii) if there is no surviving spouse or children, to the surviving parent 8 or parents, if the parent was a dependent as defined in § 152 of the Internal Revenue Code.
- 9 **[(e)] (F)** A death benefit under this section shall be paid out of funds which the 10 Governor may appropriate for that purpose in the State budget.
- 11 [(f)] (G) A decision of the Secretary under this section:
- 12 (1) is the final administrative decision; and
- 13 (2) is not subject to appeal under Title 10, Subtitle 2 of the State 14 Government Article.
- 15 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That:
- 16 (a) This section applies to an employee of the State who is killed in the 17 performance of duties on or after January 1, 2023.
- 18 (b) (1) On or before December 31, 2024, the surviving spouse, children, or dependent parent of an individual described in subsection (a) of this section may request the Secretary of Budget and Management to award the surviving spouse, children, or dependent parent, death and funeral benefits under § 10–404 of the State Personnel and Pensions Article, as enacted by Section 1 of this Act.
- 23 (2) On receipt of a request to receive death and funeral benefits under paragraph (1) of this subsection, when the Secretary of Budget and Management receives proof of death of the individual described under subsection (a) of this section and finds that the death occurred in the manner described in § 10–404 of the State Personnel and Pensions Article, as enacted by Section 1 of this Act, the Secretary shall administer the death and funeral benefits as required under § 10–404 of the State Personnel and Pensions Article, as enacted by Section 1 of this Act.
- 30 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June 31 1, 2024.
