SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
That ~~the Laws of Maryland read as follows:~~

(a) There is a Workgroup on the Creation of a Data Dashboard for Public Work Contracts and Apprentices.

(b) The Workgroup consists of the following members:

(1) three members of the Senate of Maryland, appointed by the President of the Senate;

(2) three members of the House of Delegates, appointed by the Speaker of the House;

(3) the Secretary of Labor, or the Secretary's designee;

(4) the Commissioner of Labor and Industry, or the Commissioner's designee; and

(5) the following members, appointed by the Governor:

(i) one representative of the Baltimore-DC Building Trades Council, selected by the President of the Council;

(ii) one representative of the Mid-Atlantic Pipe Trades Association;
and

(iii) one representative who is an attorney and a member of Steamfitters Union Local 602.

(c) The President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House shall designate the co-chairs of the Workgroup.

(d) The Commissioner of Labor and Industry shall provide staff for the Workgroup.

(e) A member of the Workgroup:

(1) may not receive compensation as a member of the Workgroup; but

(2) is entitled to reimbursement for expenses under the Standard State Travel Regulations, as provided in the State budget.

1 (f) At the first meeting of the Workgroup that occurs on or after July 1, 2025, the
2 Workgroup shall vote to adopt a code of conduct providing for the acceptable conduct of
3 Workgroup members.

4 (g) The Workgroup shall:

5 (1) study the most efficient and cost-effective method to create a publicly
6 available data dashboard that disaggregates information regarding public work contracts
7 with the State, including information on:

8 (i) the name of each contractor and subcontractor working under a
9 public work contract;

10 (ii) wages, including overtime wages, and benefits paid to each
11 employee of a contractor or subcontractor working under a public work contract;

12 (iii) the job classification of each employee employed by a contractor
13 or subcontractor working under a public work contract;

14 (iv) apprentices working under each contractor and subcontractor for
15 public works contracts, including:

16 1. the number of apprentices employed;

17 2. demographic information for each apprentice;

18 3. the date each apprentice registered with the Maryland
19 Department of Labor;

20 4. the trade practiced by each apprentice; and

21 5. the certification status of each apprentice; and

22 (v) each apprenticeship program sponsored by each contractor or
23 subcontractor working under a public work contract; and

24 (2) make recommendations regarding:

25 (i) where the data dashboard shall be located;

26 (ii) necessary costs associated with the development and
27 maintenance of the data dashboard; and

28 (iii) time frames during which the data dashboard can be developed
29 and implemented and the frequency with which the information in the data dashboard can
30 be updated.

1 (h) On or before January 7, 2027, the Workgroup shall report its findings and
2 recommendations to the Governor and, in accordance with § 2-1257 of the State
3 Government Article, the General Assembly.

25 January 31, 2027, this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall
26 be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
