1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Family Law – Permanent Protective Orders – Consent**

3 FOR the purpose of specifying that an individual may consent to the issuance of a
4 permanent protective order against the individual; and generally relating to
5 permanent protective orders.

11 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
12 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

13 **Article – Family Law**

14 4–506.

15 (k) (1) Notwithstanding any other provision of this section, the court shall
16 issue a permanent protective order under this subsection against an individual if:

17 (i) an interim, temporary, or final protective order has been issued
18 under this subtitle against the individual;

1 (ii) 1. the individual was convicted and sentenced to serve a term
 2 of imprisonment of at least 5 years for the act of abuse that led to the issuance of the
 3 interim, temporary, or final protective order and the individual has served at least 12
 4 months of the sentence; [or]

5 2. A. during the term of the interim, temporary, or final
 6 protective order, the individual committed an act of abuse against the person eligible for
 7 relief; and

8 B. the individual was convicted and sentenced to serve a term
 9 of imprisonment of at least 5 years for the act and has served at least 12 months of the
 10 sentence; [and] OR

11 **3. THE INDIVIDUAL CONSENTS TO THE ISSUANCE OF THE**
 12 **PERMANENT PROTECTIVE ORDER; AND**

13 (iii) the victim of the act of abuse described in item (ii)1 or 2 of this
 14 paragraph, who was the person eligible for relief in the interim, temporary, or final
 15 protective order, requests the issuance of a permanent protective order under this
 16 subsection.

17 (2) In a permanent protective order issued under this subsection, the court
 18 may grant only the relief that was granted in the original protective order under §
 19 4-504.1(c)(1) or (2) or § 4-505(a)(2)(i) or (ii) of this subtitle or subsection (d)(1) or (2) of this
 20 section.

21 (3) Unless terminated at the request of the victim, a protective order issued
 22 under this subsection shall be permanent.

23 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
 24 October 1, 2025.
