**BILL:** HB772: Maryland Green Purchasing Committee - Food Procurement – GHG Emissions  
**COMMITTEE:** House Health and Government Operations Committee  
**POSITION:** Testimony of Support of House Bill 0772

**BILL ANALYSIS:** Requiring the Maryland Green Purchasing Committee to develop on or before January 1, 2022, a certain methodology, in consultation with the Department of the Environment and the Department of General Services, for a unit to estimate greenhouse gas emissions that occur through the life cycle of certain food; requiring each unit to report to the Committee on the unit's progress in reducing the greenhouse gas emissions associated with food procured by the unit on or before August 1, 2024 and each August 1 thereafter; etc.

Chair Pendergrass, Vice Chair Peña-Melnk and members of the committee:

The Montgomery County Food Council supports a comprehensive, sustainable food purchasing policy that aims to reduce greenhouse gas emissions in Maryland. Such a bill would offer significant environmental benefits and establish the State as a pioneer in addressing and reducing the impacts of climate change.

As this conversation continues, however, we encourage the State to incorporate guidance provisions for the Maryland Green Purchasing Committee that will ensure clarity of the proposed methodology, as well as the monitoring and evaluation process associated with the proposed methodology. We also encourage the State to simultaneously evaluate how our purchasing can continue to support local farmers and our local food economy, ensure nutritionally dense menu offerings, and provide culturally-appropriate options that are fairly priced to accommodate low-income residents, as well as other considerations. For these reasons, we support HB772, and urge the Committee to consider the elements noted above in their discussion on and review of this bill.

Members of the Montgomery County Food Council are available and interested in participating in the process to assist the Maryland Green Purchasing Committee in developing the methodology to compare the environmental impact of various foods, and would offer expertise and input where appropriate.

The Montgomery County Food Council is an independent council formed and led by individual community members and representatives of local businesses, government, non-profit organizations, and educational institutions.
