RE HB910 (SB958):

Of course, the law will do nothing to reduce crime as 3-D printed firearms have yet to be used in crimes. In addition, the prohibitions on the sharing of manufacturing-related computer programs is much too broad. Programs used in the 3-D printing of nearly any item have a great deal of similarity to those used in the printing of firearms parts, thus, the law as written could make the sharing of such unrelated code a crime.

RE HB1257 (SB816):

The proposed law will make the selling of firearms so costly and cumbersome that no business owner will want to engage in the trade. Will we start adding these sort of requirements to any vendor of potentially lethal devices? Kitchen stores making videos for those buying cleavers? Auto dealers making videos of car buyers?
