Subject: **SB989 – Hate Crimes – Penalty (Educate Against Hate Act)**

Position: **Oppose**

The Legislative Committee of the Criminal Law & Practice Section of the Maryland State Bar Association (MSBA) **Opposes SB989 – Hate Crimes – Penalty (Educate Against Hate Act)**.

This bill would require, in addition to any other penalty, that a person who has been convicted of a hate crime get at least eight hours of educational training relating to the group or community that that was subject of the criminal act.

While education in general is a good idea, we believe this requirement serves no useful purpose. An eight-hour course of education, no matter how good, is not likely to change someone whose mind is so poisoned by hate that they commit an explicit hate crime. If it does anything, it minimizes the seriousness of the crime.

For the reasons stated, we **Oppose SB989 – Hate Crimes – Penalty (Educate Against Hate Act)**.
