Many organizations in Maryland such as MESA, HCAS, the Arc MD, disability advocates and civil rights attorneys have weighed in on the 2022 language and we believe this bill will protect vulnerable students as well as teachers and staff who work in the classrooms and experience suspensions from false allegations.

Cameras are already in the schools, including cafeterias, hallways, stairwells, front office, vestibules, gymnasiums, and exteriors. We know cameras are used in these spaces as a deterrent to harm or theft, and are a powerful tool when used properly.

The cameras can only be accessed when an incident is reported.

Please support HB226 to allow cameras in self-contained classrooms in Maryland to ensure protections for our most vulnerable students and staff.
