**RE:** House Bill 933 – Favorable

Madam Chair, Madam Vice-Chair, and Members of the Committee,

My name is Henry Meiser, and I have had the privilege of previously being designated as the Student Representative of the State Commission on Suicide Prevention, and currently serve on the Board of Director for Community Crisis Services, Inc. which handles all 988 calls for the Southern Maryland Region, and supplements many other regions/states. I come to you today to request a favorable report on House Bill 933 (HB 933), Behavioral Health Crisis Response – 988 Trust Fund.

Maryland established the 988 Trust Fund in 2022 to provide dedicated funding for 988, but a permanent funding source was not established at that time. Instead, federal grants and state general revenue funds have supported Maryland's 988 launch. These state and federal funds run out next year. Maryland's 988 network needs a permanent funding source to address this fiscal cliff.

HB 933 would create this permanent funding mechanism through a \$0.25 per month 988 telecom fee modeled after Maryland's current 911 funding structure. This would generate \$15-20 million annually to support current 988 operations, investments in new technology, and targeted service expansions. This dedicated funding is essential to meet increasingly strict federal 988 standards and ensure Marylanders can access 988 for lifesaving counseling and support when they need it. Funding for 988 operations is crucial and should not be overlooked.

For these reasons, I respectfully urge a favorable report on HB 933 from this Committee.
